These super-delicious cookies were served recently at our church coffee hour. There were numerous requests that the recipe be reprinted. Mrs. Richey gave it to me in November of 1971.

CHOCOLATE-PEANUT BUTTER BALLS

1 cup of butter or margarine. Melt in double boiler. Add 2 cups chunky peanut butter. Stir until smooth. Add 1 pound powdered sugar. Stir in thoroughly. Remove to a large bowl and add 4 cups Rice Krispies. Form into balls about 1 inch in diameter.

Melt in top of double boiler 12 ounces of chocolate chips and 1-3 block of paraffin wax, stir until mixed. Dip balls in chocolate, cool on waxed paper. Store in tightly covered container in refrigerator. —From the files of Mrs. Melville Richey, Boring.

Here is another recipe needed at this time of the year.

PUMPKIN BREAD

1 cup cooking oil
No 2½ size can pumpkin (or applesauce)

4 cups sugar
5 cups flour
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon ground cloves
1 teaspoon vanilla
2 teaspoons soda
1 teaspoon salt
2 cups chopped nuts, raisins, dates, or some of all three

Mix together oil, pumpkin, and sugar. Sift together flour, spices, soda and salt. Add to first mixture and mix well. Add vanilla and mix. Then add nuts and raisins or dates. Put into 3 greased regular size bread pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour. —From the files of Mrs. Guy Chilton, Sandy. (There are no eggs in this recipe.)
