Between 250 and 300 people attended Sandy High's Open House held Thursday evening, Nov. 29.

A recent reception was held to honor Charles Lane, who served Sandy Grade School for 32 years as a teacher and principal.

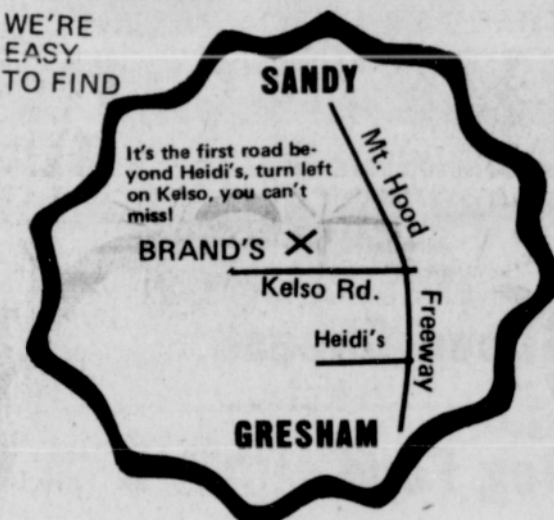
