Walter E. Koch, Sr.

Walter Edward Koch Sr., well known mill owner and lumberman, died Dec. 4, at a Gresham hospital, results of a massive heart attack.

"Walt" Koch was born Jan. 25, 1897, at Boring, and was 76 years of age at his death. He attended school at Cottrell, became a logger while a young man, and as his interests in lumbering progressed, became the owner and operator of the Koch Lumber Mills of Sandy. He was vitally interested in community affairs, and active in city and county problems.

On July 5, 1922 at St. Helens, he married Lanthie Vandell. They made their home at Sandy, and though he was well known in the lumber industry, his first love was his ranch where he raised special black Angus cattle.

At the time of WWI, he enlisted in the U.S. Army, and during his term of service, spent one year in France. He was a member of the VFW of Gresham, a charter member of the American Legion of Carson, Wash., a charter member of the American Legion of Sandy, a charter member of the Gresham Elks, 1805, a member of the Sandy Lodge AF and AM 158, a member of The Scottish Rite of Portland, a member of the Al Kader Shrine of Portland, and a charter member of the Order of Eagles of Bingen, Wash. He attended the Lutheran Church.

The surviving members of his family include his wife Lanthie of Sandy, one son Walter E. Koch Jr., of Boring, two daughters, Mrs. Ernest (June) Nichols of Sandy, and Mrs. Fortune (Aileen) Gordien, of Claremont, Calif. There are nine grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren. Three brothers and one sister also survive. They are Alfred of Moro, John of Bingen, Wash., George Koch of Portland and Mrs. Emma Rannow of Boring.

Funeral services will be Friday, Dec. 7, 2 p.m. in the Chapel of Carroll Funeral Home, Gresham. Vault interment will be in Forest Lawn Cemetery, Gresham. Pastor Don Wineinger will offer the services, and William Elliott is the musician.
