Holiday greenery tips told

Shipments of holiday greenery may again be made from Oregon to all other states without formal inspection certificates being attached if it meets two basic requirements.

Most important is that it not have roots but consists of severed plant parts destined for decorative purposes only.

Second requirement is that it be free of disease and insect hitch-hikers to avoid transfer of a disorder from one state to another.

William Kosesan, state department of agriculture and Wilbur W. Burkhart, area extension agent offer the following suggestions to greenery shippers.

All greenery should be examined before being cut to insure high quality and freedom from disease.

When cut, shipment should be made immediately by the most rapid method available.

Pack all greenery in sturdy, moisture proof containers having inner moisture barrier liners.

Holly should be treated with the standard hormone dip to insure maintenance of high quality during shipment and use. Dip solution concentrates are available at all garden centers.

Living plants including Christmas trees obtained at retail garden centers or nurseries may be shipped or taken from Oregon to other states when they bear the growers official inspection certificate.

The special moratorium on inspections does not extend beyond the Christmas holidays, Burkhart.

County slates police academy

Sheriff Joe Shobe announced this week that the 18th Annual Clackamas County Sheriff's Police Academy will be conducted from Jan. 8, 1974 through March 19, 1974. The academy training will be presented in cooperation with Clackamas Community College.

Classes will be held on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. at Clackamas Community College for a total of 63 hours. The course is certified by the State Board of Police Standards and Training.

The college will also offer six credit hours for the course. Experienced and qualified volunteer instructors are furnished by the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office, Clackamas County District Attorney's Office, Clackamas County Juvenile Department, Federal Bureau of Investigation, Municipal Police Departments and private law practice.

The course will include such subjects as Criminal Law, Juvenile Code, Report Writing, Accident Investigation, Patrol

Techniques, Search and Seizure, Criminal Investigation and Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs.

"This annual Police Academy," said Sheriff Shobe, "provides the nucleus of training that is necessary for police officers to perform their duties effectively. He added, "Enrollment in this course is open to regular and reserve police officers throughout Clackamas County."

Meeting discusses finances

During 1973 public awareness and interest in campaign financing has greatly intensified. The 1973 Oregon Legislative Assembly responded with a comprehensive revision of Chapter 260 of the Oregon Revised Statutes pertaining to campaign finance regulations and election offenses. Enactment of this legislation establishes a limit on campaign spending and regulates candidates and political committees more stringently, according to Clackamas County Clerk, George Poppen.

1974 will see both the primary election in May and the general election in November. In order to inform the candidates, political treasurers and any interested citizen of the new regulations Poppen will conduct a seminar on Dec. 17 from 7:30 p.m. to 9 p.m. in Circuit Courtroom No. 2 on the second floor of the Clackamas County Courthouse. Assisting Poppen will be Dick Banton, Manager of Elections for the State of Oregon, from the Secretary of State's Office in Salem.

A presentation on the new laws will be followed by a general question and answer session. For information 655-8551.
