If you have moved to Oregon this year and your out-of-state license plates will soon be expiring, the Oregon Motor Vehicles Division reminds you that you must bring your vehicle to a field office when you apply for your Oregon title and registration.

division to inspect the vehicle identification number of all vehicles bearing out-of-state license plates before an Oregon title can be issued.

There is a \$5 fee to inspect the vehicle identification number. The law applies to all types of vehicles except campers and snowmobiles.
