To a packed assembly hall on Thursday, March 14, Petrie said, "Most of us go through our lives and don't know what it is to be disabled. It would be hard for me to conceive what my life would be like if I couldn't run and play and walk." Walk-A-Thon proceeds go to March of Dimes work in birth defects. Sporting the beginnings of a beard and admittedly tired from a long Eastern road trip, Geoff got roars of approval as he asked young people to make an extra effort for the event. "When I play a game, I know if I did a good job. Nobody has to tell me. Doing a good job is one of the great feelings of being alive. If you go out there and do your best, you'll know it, and Portland will benefit and children everywhere will benefit."

Also speaking was Mrs. Rhea Esposito of Lake Oswego, Clackamas County Mother's March chairman. She congratulated students on their enthusiasm, saying, "It took the younger set to show the parents how to do it."

MHCC Board seats to be filled in May

Three of seven seats on the Mt. Hood Community College District Board of Education are to be filled in an election May 7. Two members are representatives of zones three and four within the Mt. Hood District. The third is an "at-large" position.

Dr. Frank Roberts is the present elected board member from zone three and he is seeking re-election to serve another four-year term from that zone. The approximate borders form the area are:

north, the Columbia River; south, Halsey Street; east, 162nd; and west, 92nd tapering over to the airport.

Peggy Wolsborn, who is undecided about being a candidate at this time, is presently representing zone four and the person elected to the position May 7 will serve a three-year term. The zone is approximately bordered on the north by Halsey Street, south by Powell Boulevard, east by 141st, and west by 92nd.

Thomas Hollenbeck is representing position seven, which is one of two seats on the board for "members-at-large". Hollenbeck is seeking re-election for a four-year term.

Voters in precincts contained within zones three and four will decide on their representatives while all voters in the college district are eligible to cast a ballot for position seven.

Persons living in the appropriate zones are eligible to seek election to the zone positions, while any person in the district may run for the "at-large" seat. The deadline for filing as a candidate is April 2. Petitions with at least 25 signatures of persons living within the appropriate zone or a \$10 filing fee is recommended to be turned in to Multnomah County Division of Elections at 11th and Southeast Morrison, or the college's business office, by March 28. This deadline is a revision of the previously announced date and also affords an opportunity for the signatures to be verified.

Further information for possible candidates may be obtained by contacting the Division of Elections, or Larry Oslund, college business manager.
