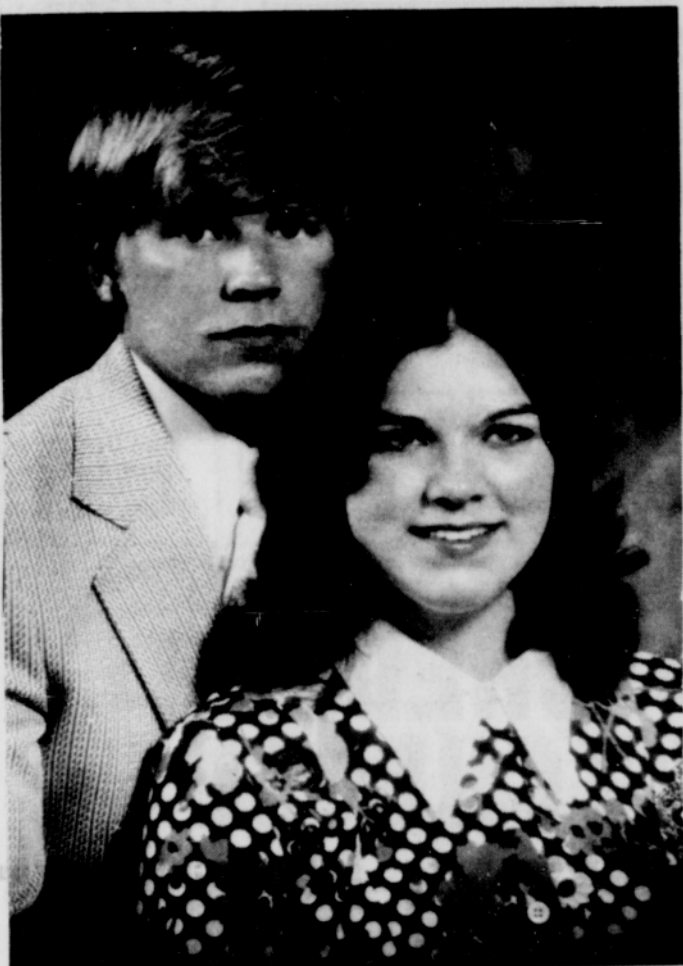

What's Cooking?

TOP OF THE STOVE MEAT LOAF

1 can Campbell's Tomato Rice soup
1 1/2 lbs. ground beef
1/2 cup fine dry bread crumbs
1 egg, slightly beaten
1/4 cup finely chopped onion
1 teaspoon salt
Mix thoroughly 1/4 cup soup with remaining five ingredients. Shape firmly into two loaves. Brown in skillet in shortening. Cover; simmer 25 minutes. Spoon off fat. Add remaining soup, and 1-3 cup water. Cook uncovered 10 minutes; stir often. Makes 6 servings.—From the files of Mrs. Howard W. Berger, Sandy.

SEABREEZE SALAD DESSERT

3 pkgs. (3 oz.) lemon gelatin mixed with 1/2 cup sugar
2 cups boiling water
2 cups cold water, (use pineapple juice as part of water)

1 cup drained crushed pineapple
1 can lemon pie filling or 1 large pkg. lemon pudding mix made according to package directions
1 package Dream Whip made according to pkg. directions
Mix gelatin and sugar in 7 1/2" x12" pyrex dish, dissolve in boiling water, then add cold water. Refrigerate until mixture becomes syrupy. Stir in lemon pie filling or pudding. Take out 3/4 cup of mixture and reserve.

Add drained pineapple to mixture in pyrex dish. Prepare Dream Whip according to directions and fold in the 3/4 cup reserved mixture. Then spread over top of congealed salad. Serves 10-12.—From the files of Mrs. Lyle Howard, Ottumwa, Iowa. This is a tangy tart salad which is delicious with foul or pork.

BAKED PORK CHOPS

OR PORK STEAK

10 pork chops or 6 pork steaks
1 pkg. onion soup mix
Sprinkle dry onion soup mix over floured chops or steaks. Wrap in foil and bake for 30 minutes at 350 degrees, lower temperature to 250 degrees and bake for 1 1/2 hours more. Open the foil the last half hour of baking time so meat will brown.—From the files of Mrs. Wayne Johnson, Sandy.
