## September log exports fall

A total of 148.8 million board feet of softwood logs, Scribner scale, was exported from all ownerships in Washington, Oregon, northern California, and Alaska this September.

The September volume was down 31.5 per cent from August 1974 exports, and down 18.1 per cent from the September 1973 total, according to research economist David Darr of the U.S. Forest Service, Pacific Northwest Forest and Range Experiment Station in Portland.

Some 142.7 million board feet, or 95.9 per cent of the September 1974 west coast log exports, went to Japan.

September exports from Washington and Oregon totaled 147.7 million board feet, down 29 per cent from the August volume.

September shipments from northern California totaled 6,000 board feet, down from the August volume of 6.6 million board feet. Alaska exported a total of 1.1 million board feet in September, compared with 2.7 million board feet in August.

Douglas-fir accounted for 33.8 per cent of September exports, and Port-Orford-

cedar, 2.4 per cent. Other softwoods, primarily western hemlock and true firs, made up the remaining 63.8 per cent.
