

Broader revenue source eyed by Tri-Met

Stephan R. McCarthy, assistant general manager of Tri-Met, told the Governor's Task Force on Transportation that Tri-Met can raise all needed revenue with existing tax sources if necessary.

"But," McCarthy said, "we are looking to broader revenue sources, so the payroll tax doesn't have to carry the whole burden."

He added that to implement the Tri-Met goals currently being studied, \$54 million will be needed over the next five years. Implementation of these

Traffic volume on most of Oregon's highways showed an increase in vehicular traffic in August, 1974 compared to August of 1973, according to the monthly report compiled by the Oregon State Highway Division.

A summary of the permanent traffic recorder data for rural

and urban state highways showed an increase of 1.8 per cent in vehicular traffic in August, 1974 compared to August of 1973.

The first eight months of 1974 showed a decrease of 6.6 per cent in vehicular traffic compared to the first eight months of 1973.

consumption and decreased congestion and traffic.

To accomplish this, \$54 million is needed over the next five years to buy buses and pay drivers' salaries for increased service, to build shelters and to provide for express bus service.

The Governor's Task Force heard the review of Tri-Met's funding situation, including a discussion of income and gas taxes, as well as of changing the present constitutional limitation on use of gas and auto-derived revenue.

Sandy man charged

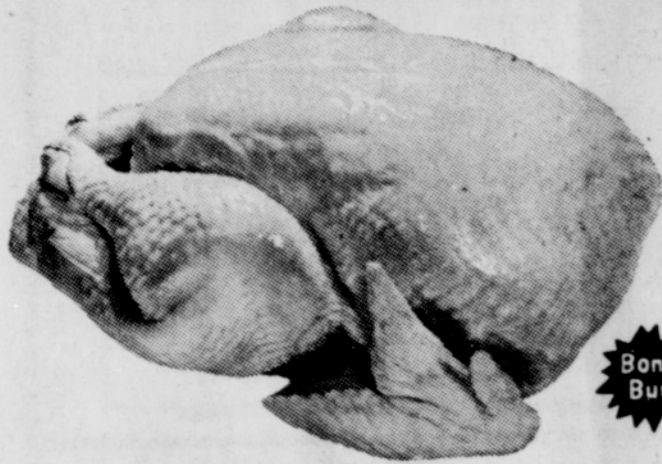

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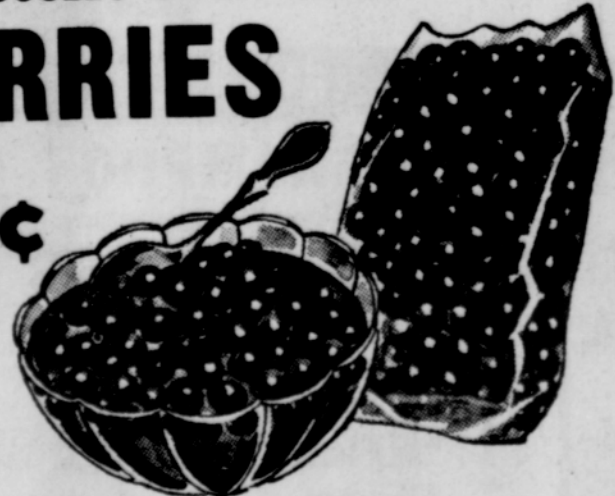
