

Blue Marlins bite Cheltenham

Sandy's Blue Marlin Aquatic Club completely drowned the Cheltenham Swim Club, from Newberg, in the first dual meet of the season.

The Sandy team racked up 313½ points to Cheltenham's 145½ points.

A number of the Blue Marlin Swimmers will be travelling to Tigard next Sunday, Nov. 24, to participate in an AAA invitational meet. The next meet is scheduled at the Sandy pool in the A invitational to be held on Saturday, Dec. 7.

Saturday's home meet with Cheltenham was the first opportunity for Coach Mark Smith and Ron Johnson to see their swimmers in action. Both coaches say they are looking forward to a successful season. Swimmers scoring points for Blue Marlins were:

MHCC offers sports dollars for women

According to the September edition of Billie Jean King's "womenSports" magazine, Mt. Hood Community College is the only school in Oregon offering financial assistance to women athletes.

"In our own way, we've tried to stay ahead of this thing," explained MHCC Athletic Director Dutch Triebwasser. "More people have to get away from the notion that these girls

involved in athletics are playing some kind of game with their demands. They are serious. And they've got the law on their side."

Mt. Hood coaches Dorian Harris and Alice Gustafson control their own budget, which includes seven tuition waivers of about \$275 each for basketball, tennis, track and volleyball.

"Our priority is to give it to girls who can help us in two sports," said Harris. "I'm more prone to help somebody who really needs it."

Tuition waivers are only given during season. A gal who plays volleyball and track, for example, might get help fall and winter terms.

"Last spring—the first term we offered them—I gave them to a couple of sophomores who had worked real hard for two years," said Harris. "This year is the testing ground."

Contrary to the magazine article, Harris believes Oregon State and OCE offer some kind of financial aid to women athletes.

"The Title IX law (equality to women) needs time to take effect, but it's going to make a difference," said Triebwasser.

"The sad thing about the history of women is that they have never had anybody backing them."

The Northwest College Women's Sports Association strictly prohibits active recruiting by women coaches.

"A youngster should not decide where to go to school just because of financial assistance for athletics," said Harris. "But this fall we have had more inquiries about them than ever before."
