Community Action Center offers array of services

Sandy Community Action Center is now offering a new service of legal aid on Thursday mornings 9:30 to 12:30. Appointments may be made at the Center or by phoning 668-4746.

This new service was discussed at a meeting of the Sandy Community Action Council last Thursday under the leadership of Dick Harrison, president of Council. Doug Meeker, director of the Community Action Center, reported serving people with emergency food and helping many in matters of clothing. Referrals to sources of help in employment and health are being made. Meeker reported receiving generous contributions of women's and girl's clothing but needing contributions of men's outer wear, boy's clothing, and clothing for babies.

Helen Sulzbach, chairman of the Well Baby Clinic reported a record 21 infants at

the clinic that morning. Infants from birth to three years are weighed, measured, and examined by a doctor and two nurses from the county health department.

Needed inoculations are given at the same time and mothers are advised concerning the health of their children. The next clinic will be held on Dec. 12, at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Sandy. Mothers should phone the

Community Action Center in advance for an appointment. Dorothy DePro, Community Action Center treasurer reported an award of \$1,200 to be received from Clackamas County Social Services Coalition. Joe Youngbluth represents Sandy City Council on the coalition. The coalition receives money from various cities in the county and awards these funds to social service organizations within the county

that are doing effective work. Youngbluth and Harrison have been attending 6:30 a.m. meetings to help make the decisions involved.

The Sandy Community Action Center requires about \$200 per month for rent and utilities. This does not include expenditures made for food and various emergency helps to people in need. Several church related and other organizations help the center to meet costs of its work.

The center will offer its annual Christmas party for kids and parents on Dec. 14.

Before concluding its meeting last Thursday the Community Action Council voted to invite two federal agencies to use the center while working in the Sandy area. They are: SEARCH and Manpower. Both are related to finding and helping people use their talents in gainful employment and to extend their training.
