What's New at the Library

"Beginnings!"

The writer is 17 years old, and her book is just as brash and breezy as people in that age group are apt to be; and just as fresh and delightful!

Sana, the heroine, is the daughter of an unconventional American family spending a year in London, and she, her brothers and a cockney friend dance through the pages with verve and joy.

Their solutions to the world's problems may be a bit simplistic, but at least they are trying. And if Sana's acceptance of the revelation at the end of the summer (and the book) shows more equanimity than is usual with turbulent adolescents, it is nevertheless consistent with Sana's character, which is as sensitive, perceptive, and as compassionate as the young author's.

Readers will await Ms. Juliusberger's next novel with eager anticipation, and some trepidation: could another book possibly match the exhilarating originality of this one?

Nothing new or startling here, but exquisite photography—over one hundred full color photos and maps—and literate prose detailing segments of African life.

The differences, the idiosyncrasies of the various tribes are nicely illustrated in anecdotes, and the descriptions of the landscapes occasionally soar into poetry: "a spray of stars frozen against the sky."

A little of everything: a smattering of history, a tidbit of archeology, some current sociology. Worth reading if you are an Africa buff, worth skimming even if you aren't. Don't miss the photos—they're gorgeous!

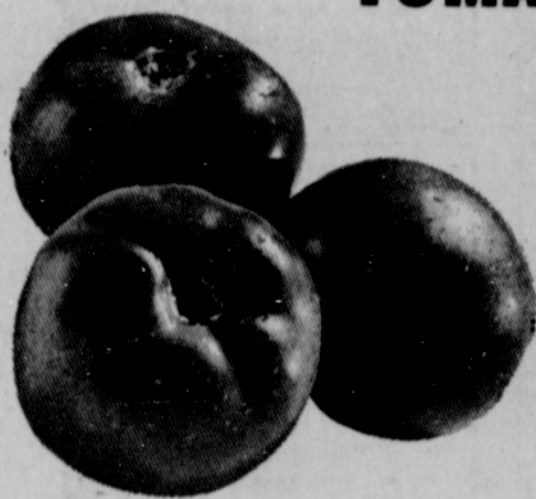

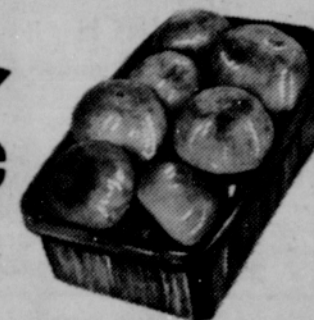
