Classes scheduled include "Money Management for Small Businesses," which begins Tuesday, Jan. 6 at 7 p.m. and will feature planning stages, cash flow, preparation of taxes and analysis of financial statements for the small business. Registration will be held at the first class meeting.

"The Law and Your Small Business" will begin Wednesday, Jan. 7 at 7 p.m. and will be taught by an attorney. The course will cover discussion of forms of business organization, incorporation, civil and contractual liability, contracts and consumer protection.

"Taxes and the Small Business" will begin Wednesday, Jan. 7 at 7 p.m. and will cover income taxes for

proprietorships, partnerships and corporations. Business deductions, excise taxes and employment taxes will also be discussed.

All of these classes are offered at MHCC with the cooperation of the Small Business Administration.
