

Clackamas college budget proposed

A \$7,012,774 proposed operating budget for 1976-77 was approved by the Clackamas Community college budget committee at its Jan. 19 meeting.

The committee, composed of seven citizens and seven board members from the college district, cut \$393,805 from the preliminary document presented to them Jan. 12.

The proposed budget means the college will ask local voters to approve a levy of \$1.40 per \$1,000 true cash value at a March 9 election. Since the college has no tax base, it must go to voters for approval to operate each year.

The proposed 1976-77 operating levy is an increase of three cents more than the current year.

"In light of enrollment which

has been increasing as much as 20 per cent a year, and inflation which has hit operating costs hard, we feel the budget committee has done an excellent job of keeping the costs to the taxpayers down, says Dr. John Hakanson, college president.

The proposed budget for 1976-77 would allow some expansion and leave flexibility to meet unexpected demands during the year, Hakanson told the budget committee.

During the college's first ten years it has never had to ask voters for more than \$2 per \$1,000 valuation for bonds and operating costs, Hakanson points out.

This coming year operation and existing bonds will total slightly less than \$1.60, he says.

Agent offers pruning tips

A good pruning job requires only three pieces of equipment and some patience, says Wilbur W. Burkhart of the Extension service.

The items recommended by Burkhart include hand shears, loppers and a pruning saw.

All should be of good quality and kept lightly oiled to discourage rust and keep them operating easily, he says.

The item of greatest use is the hand shears used to clip the growth nearest the end of branches or clip out excessive numbers of berry and rose canes. Longer handled loppers allow for cutting larger branches cleanly but should not be used when diameter of the wood exceeds one inch.
