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Bob Packwood suggests seasonal alien visas

Sen. Bob Packwood, R-Ore., has suggested that the Oregon Legislature outlaw the hiring of illegal aliens but said any such law should include a provision favorable to emergency agricultural seasonal hiring.

The senator has consistently urged tighter alien registration legislation but said last week the case of under-staffed farmers also had to be considered. Oregon growers have claimed a decrease in alien hirings would cause severe problems in the state's agriculture industry. Packwood proposed agriculture be given an exemption to otherwise strict employment regulations. Employers could hire illegal aliens for seasonal jobs if the governor or another designated authority found insufficient domestic workers available and willing to take the jobs.

Packwood recently introduced a similar bill in Congress that would have an

employer examine a prospective worker's Social Security card and other identification before the person could be hired. His bill has been tabled, however, by the Senate Immigration subcommittee in favor of another, less stringent proposal.

Farm Bureau leaders in the Gresham area told Congressman Robert Duncan last week that they are opposed to the kind of limits and burden of proof Packwood is suggesting be put on the individual employer.

They said such requirements would be unworkable and would not solve the real problem of aliens entering the United States.

The farm group said the problem would be solved if the Immigration Service resumed issuance of temporary work visas.

Union officials in Oregon have also charged that illegal

aliens are now filling 30,000 jobs that rightfully belong to unemployed Oregon residents.

Forty thousand more aliens are expected from California following a new law there prohibiting their employment, the Cannery Workers Local 670 official added.

St. Jude's Home remodeling planned

Work is underway at St. Jude's Home, 39641 Scenic Street, Sandy, to remodel the upstairs area for use by home for the aged residents. When completed the project will provide 20 resident units in addition to the 63 intermediate care nursing facility beds at the first floor level.

The remodeling program, under the supervision of Tom Moore, Jr., a Gresham-Sandy contractor, will provide additional toilet and bathroom facilities for residents, a utility room and linen area, and a staff lounge and bathroom. There will be an upstairs nurse's station and offices for the general administrator, the administrative assistant and the director of nursing services.

Adams Electric Co. of Portland is installing a call bell system which connects the 20 upstairs bedrooms with the nurse's station on the second floor and the central nurse's station on the first floor area.

In addition, a special project of the Mt. Hood council of Telephone Pioneers and members of the Society of St. Paul will provide each bed in the facility with an extension of the in-house communications

system so that there will be a pillow speaker or earphones at each bedside and residents can enjoy Golden Hours radio programs, special broadcasts throughout the nursing facility, chapel services, and receive announcements of special activities over the public address system.

Most of the materials and work for this project have been donated by the telephone pioneers and members of the Society of St. Paul.

Each of the 20 rooms in the home for the aged section have been equipped with a new hospital bed styled to look like bedroom furniture.

At a meeting of St. Jude's Home board of trustees held April 30 approval was given for the development of a \$40,000 elevator project.

The hospital size elevator will be located at the north end of the nursing home building and will connect the downstairs living room with the upstairs living room. William Fletcher, a Portland architect who designed the St. Jude's building in 1962 and who is architectural consultant for the facility, is designing plans for the elevator. Work will begin on the development of the elevator

later this summer.

At the board meeting Brother Andrew, SSP, Rector of the Society of St. Paul and President of St. Jude's Home, Inc., announced that the Rev. Arlo Hoyer will become a part-time chaplain at the nursing facility beginning May 23.

The expansion of the facility to include 20 homes for the aged units on the second floor will also provide additional space for activities of both the nursing home and home for the aged sections, and will result in more effective use of the space available, he said.
