Adskim said, "the number of patients the Kidney Association of Oregon is admitting to its program continues to increase dramatically. KAO recorded a 26 per cent increase in patients, from 62 to 78 during 1975 and an

additional 19 per cent increase in patients, from 78 to 93 during the first four months of 1976."

"This continuing sharp increase in patients," he stated, "raises our financial responsibility, which means we must intensify our fund-raising efforts."

He added, "In order to do this, we must have increased support of the public so that we can save the lives of Oregonians suffering from kidney failure through the miracle of dialysis with artificial kidney machines."

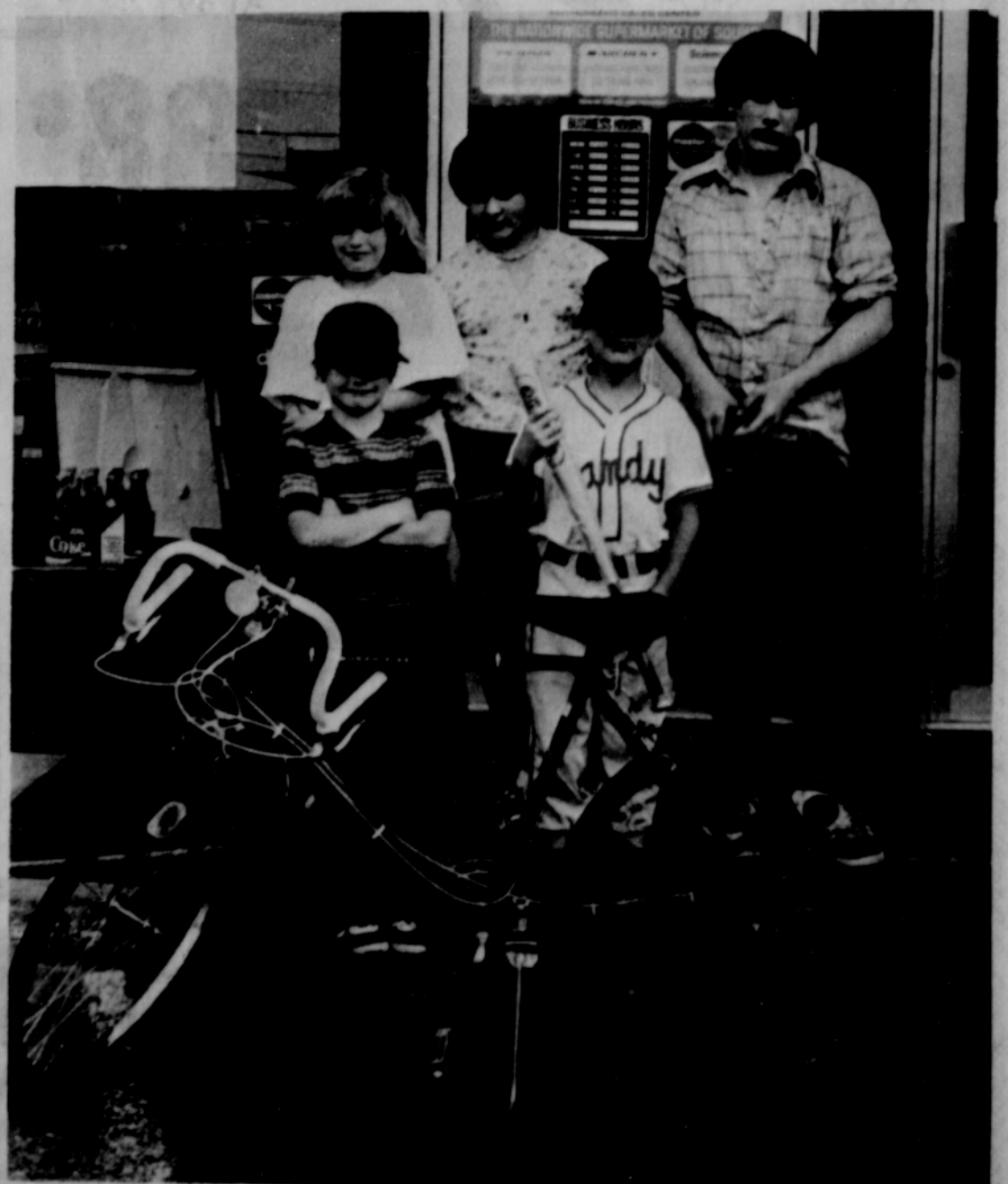
