

# Group seeks referendum right on state land use legislation

A citizens group seeking to dismantle the Columbia River Association of Governments (CRAG) has until Friday to turn in 62,000 valid signatures

of voters in the tri-county area. Much of the group's effort has been focused locally the past week. Petitions were mailed to the household of

every registered voter in Clackamas County, asking that each family fill out and return it. Jim Allison, Sherwood, is

chairman of the Committee in Favor of Initiative and Referendum, which is sponsoring the petition drive. Allison said CIFIR's

proposed constitutional amendment would: —Return control over land use planning to the people and their locally elected

representatives. —Require compensation for diminished values of land if the state legislature passes a bill which imposes restrictions on

land use in excess of those in use planning in the CRAG area," Allison stated. Allison said the petition drive gives people who complain

the locally approved comprehensive plan. (The reverse would not be true under the proposed constitutional amendment. If state land use legislation resulted in a windfall profit for a landowner, he or she would not be required to turn over part of it to the state.)

—Prevent the attachment of an emergency clause to land use legislation.

—Allow voters in the CRAG area to amend or repeal CRAG laws by a tri-county vote in lieu of the currently required statewide vote.

"Passage of the amendment in November would make unconstitutional those portions of SB 100 and SB 769 which allow the Land Conservation and Development Commission (LCDC) and CRAG to take over local land use planning and force changes in locally approved comprehensive plans."

"(Portland Mayor Neil) Goldschmidt would no longer have effective control over land about CRAG something they can do about it."

"It may be their last chance to control this monster in time to do any good. CRAG has never been voted on by the people since the 1973 legislature created it in 1973 with SB 769. The legislature attached an emergency clause to the bill which prevented referendum. There was no emergency."

And, Allison claims, CRAG still has no regional goals or objectives "after 2½ years of bungling."

## Fryer group approves budget

Members of the Oregon Fryer Commission approved a budget of \$100,000 for the fiscal year at a meeting June 22 in Salem. The budget is down \$1,700 from the one for 1975-76.

Largest single item on the budget is the \$50,342 allocated for special promotions. This covers radio and television advertising; the commission's cook books and homemaker's hand books; special fliers and cooperative advertising with stores and restaurants.

In addition to the fees for the special promotion materials the commission also pays its advertising firm a \$3,000 retainer fee.

Second largest item on the budget is the \$17,758 for regular employees of the commission.

This is for actual salaries paid. In addition to this the commission has allocated \$4,800 for other purchased services covering the administrative duties and other office work done for it by the Oregon Department of Agriculture.
