Founding pastor's son speaker at anniversary

The Rev. Herman H. Koppelman, D.D., will be the guest speaker at the 75th anniversary celebration of Immanuel Lutheran Church on Sunday, Jan. 9, at 9 a.m.

He is the son of the first pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran Mission of Sandy, the Rev. H.H. Koppelman.

Dr. Koppelman spent 27 years in executive service in the Missouri Synod's mission activities. He was president of

the Lutheran Foreign Mission Conference of North America from 1961-66.

He made six extensive trips to missions and churches in Asia, two to South America and two to Europe.

Dr. Koppelman was elected to "Who's Who in America" in 1968 and "Who's Who in the World" in 1973.

His elementary education was at Zion Lutheran School in Portland. He was graduated from Concordia College in Portland in 1926 and graduated from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Mo., in 1932.

The Rev. Koppelman retired in October, 1975, but is president of "Stamps for

Missions" which provides about \$10,000 a year for mission projects.

He is also secretary of the Council for Christian Medical Work and a member of the Board of Governors, St. Louis chapter of Concordia Historical Institute.

When Pastor Frank Koepke, the present pastor, was in mission work in Japan and when former Pastor W.A. Luedtke was a missionary in India, Pastor Koppelman was their supervisor.

The Sandy Union High School Symphonic Choir will sing at the 9 a.m. service.

A potluck dinner will be served at noon.
