Every day on OPBS Channel 10 we have an opportunity to see how our legislative process works. It was interesting to see the formality of that opening joint session on Monday and hear Governor Straub's State of

the State message. Sessions are aired from 9-10 a.m. and again from 11-12:30. Between 7:30 and 8 every evening they will have announcements of what legislation will be on the floor at the next day's session. This will be a five day week telecast that gives us all a chance to know exactly what

our state government is discussing, deciding upon and putting into law. This is the 59th session of Oregon Legislature and it's a real milestone to bring the actual proceedings right to the people.

After Mrs. Cutler goes through the class assignment for the children she continues with an in-depth Bible study of the scripture presented.

Boring nurse heads program

The Clackamas Intermediate Education District (IED) volunteer school nurse program was launched Jan. 4 when the IED hired Vera Lange, a registered nurse from Boring, to supervise the program.

Lange will be responsible for setting up the program in Clackamas County schools, recruiting volunteer nurses, orientation and in-service training.

Through the program, volunteer nurses will work in schools that need more nursing staff. The emphasis will be on placing volunteers in schools that only have nursing service on a part time basis.

The IED expects to attract unemployed nurses who need minimum time in practice to maintain their credentials. By law, nurses in Oregon must work at least 48 days to every two years to keep their cer-

tification. Nurses who volunteer for the program will work five and a half hours a day, one day a week, in schools throughout the county.

Under the program, there will be no charge for services to the schools. The supervisor's salary and travel will be paid by a two year grant from the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA) administered by the IED.

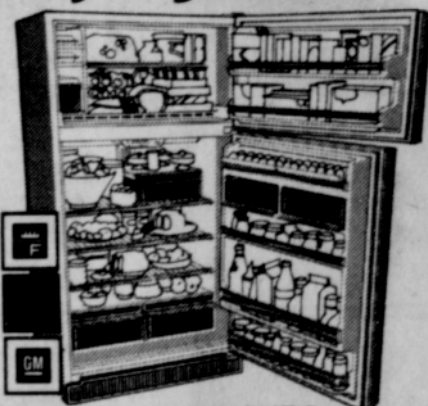


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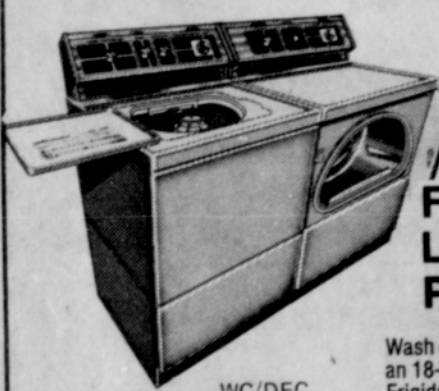


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
