Baked salmon, strawberry chiffon pie

Baked Salmon
6 to 8 pounds fresh salmon
Stuffing:
1/4 cup butter
1 cup chopped onion
1/2 cup grated carrot
1 cup mushrooms
2 cups bread crumbs
1 beaten egg
Chopped parsley
1 1/2 tablespoons lemon juice
2 teaspoons salt
1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
1/4 teaspoon marjoram
Melt butter and saute onion. Add balance of ingredients and mix well. Stuff salmon. Tie or fasten with skewers.
Wrap in foil and bake one hour at 350 degrees. Serves 8-10.

1/4 cup flour
1 cup milk
1 tablespoon sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 can niblet corn, drained
1 cup canned tomatoes, drained
3/4 cup dry bread crumbs
2 tablespoons melted butter
Make white sauce of first three ingredients. Add salt and sugar, then corn and tomatoes. Pour into buttered casserole. Cover with buttered crumbs. Bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes.

Potatoes O'Brien
6 medium potatoes
6 tablespoons butter or margarine
4 1/2 tablespoons flour
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
2 1/4 cups milk
1 1/2 cups grated cheese
Cook potatoes in jackets. Cool, peel and dice. Melt butter; stir in flour, salt and pepper, stirring until blended. Add milk and cook over low heat stirring constantly until thickened. Remove from heat and stir in cheese until melted. Arrange potatoes in greased 2-qt. casserole and pour cheese sauce over them. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes.
May be prepared ahead of time and baked just before serving. Serves 6-8.

Strawberry Chiffon Pie
1 (10 ounce) package frozen sliced strawberries, thawed
1 (3 ounce) package berry flavored gelatin
1/4 teaspoon salt
3 egg yolks
1 tablespoon lemon juice
3 egg whites
1/4 cup sugar
1 baked 9 inch pie shell
Drain juice from berries. Set berries aside, measure juice and add water, if necessary to make one cup of liquid. Pour liquid into sauce pan.
Put gelatin and salt in bowl, heat one cup liquid to boiling; pour over gelatin and stir until dissolved.
In separate bowl, beat yolks until thickened. Slowly pour hot gelatin into yolks, stirring constantly.
Add strawberries and lemon juice. Chill until it mounds.
Beat egg whites, add sugar at intervals. Continue beating until whites form soft, shiny peaks. Fold into first mixture.
Pour into baked pie shell and chill until firm. Before serving spread whipped cream over top.

Meatball Casserole with Pineapple
1 pound ground beef
1 onion, chopped
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup catsup
2 tablespoons white vinegar
1/4 cup brown sugar
2 teaspoons dry mustard
1 can kidney beans
1 can baked brown beans
2 (14 ounce) cans pineapple tidbits (drained)
Mix meat with onion and salt. Form into balls and saute until cooked. Remove, and in the same pan blend in catsup, vinegar, brown sugar and mustard. Bring to a boil. Place the beans and pineapple in a casserole. Add the meat and pour the sauce over all. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 to 40 minutes. Serves 6.

Breast cancer clinic slated

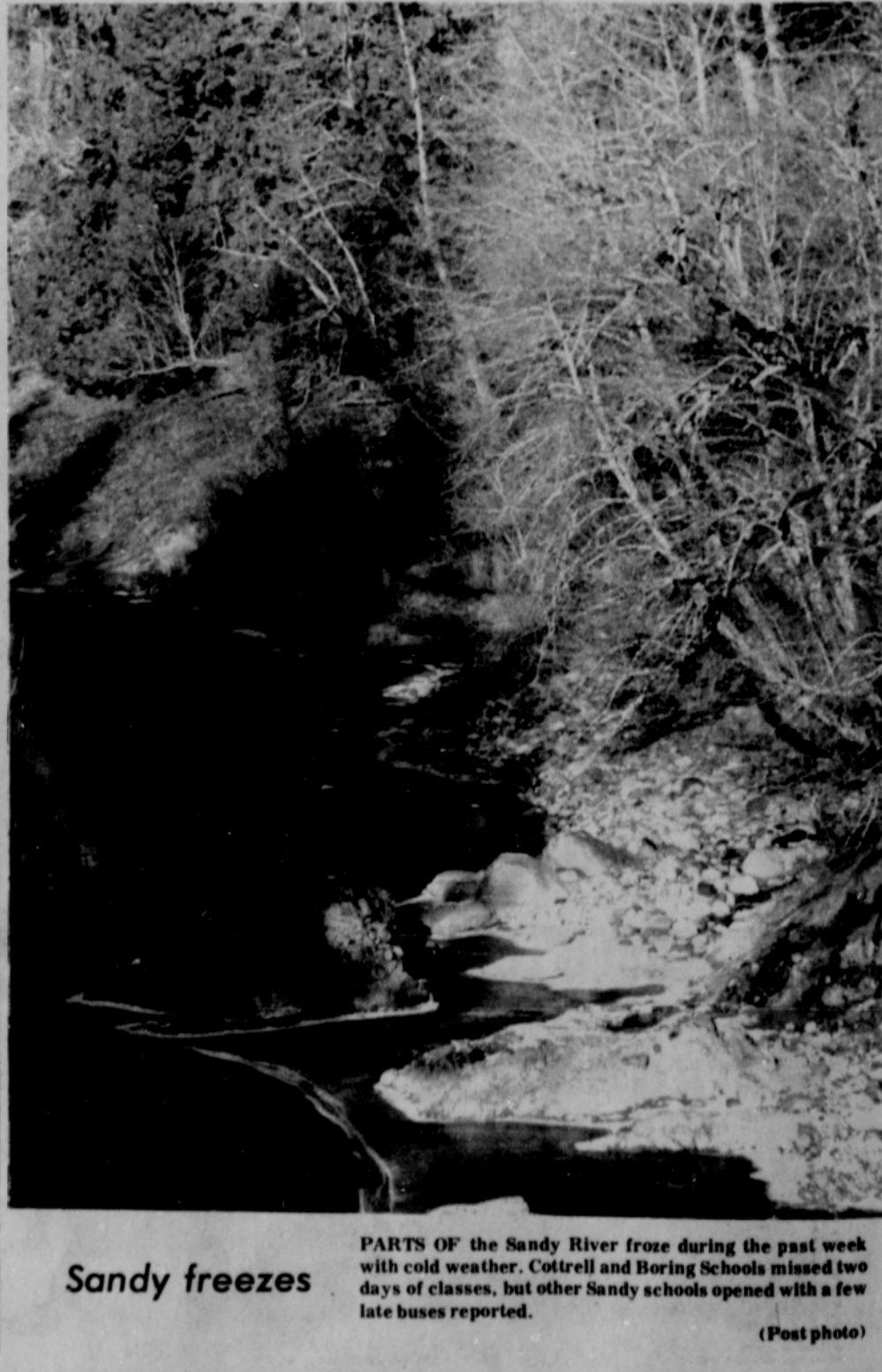
A breast cancer training clinic will be held in the trailer of the Sandy Community School on Tuesday, Jan. 18.
