**Buying tool goal of club**

BORING—What started as a coffee klatch among area business people has grown into a full-fledged service project. The Boring Business Club is having a game night at 8 p.m. Thursday, April 28, to earn money to buy the Boring Fire Department a Hurst rescue tool.

Called the Jaws of Life, the tool is used to save people who have been in automobile, mill or farm accidents, according to Fire Chief Matt Shields. The firemen have been using Gresham's and Sandy's rescue tool as part of a mutual aid agreement, but having their own tool would save valuable time Shields said.

"Now we have to go to the scene and see we need it and then contact one of the other departments," Shields said. The drive began when two individuals from Boring each donated \$1,000. Since then, an additional \$220 has been collected. The benefit sponsors hope to make up the difference to purchase the \$5,000 tool, Yvonne McCall of McCall's Country Store, said. She hopes people from the

whole 64-square-mile Boring Fire District, which includes Damascus, Eagle Creek, Barton, Cottrell, Hillview and Kelso, will attend the benefit. Tickets are available at the fire hall, Boring True-Value Hardware, McCall's, Sunrise Realty, Tom's Arco and Mt. View Golf Course, where the event will be held. No one under 18 will be admitted. Shields said some people have suggested that the tool is

probably making a bundle of money for the person who invented it. "The high cost is because it's made of exotic metals to keep the weight down," he explained. "The 60-pound tool, which has a portable power generator which sits 15 feet away from the actual tool, has strength but not much weight. "And they haven't broken one yet."
