Jerry Justice, assistant to the Clackamas County Board of Commissioners, has been tabbed to represent the Municipal Water Advisory Committee on Drought in Governor Straub's newly formed Industry Advisory Committee on Drought.

Justice described the governor's new committee as an attempt to get industry input concerning water conservation measures.

"Straub seeks to get people involved in the decision making process," Justice told The Post, "with an emphasis on

voluntary commitments."

The new committee is composed chiefly of major industrial representatives. Justice said his chief role will be to identify the types of situations industry proposals could create for municipal water districts.

The occasion is the annual 4-H Rabbit Judging Contest sponsored by the Clackamas County 4-H Rabbit and Poultry Committee. Under the guidance of Vi Robinson, Gresham, and Miller Reser, Sandy, the day's events will

feature a variety of activities where 4-H members and leaders may practice the 4-H motto "Learn by Doing".

Classes will include New Zealand bucks and does, rabbit production records, fryers, rabbit pelts, Californias, and Satins.

Beginning at 9:30 a.m. with registration the program will proceed to a workshop on judging prior to the actual contest. Vern Palmblad, Boring, will conduct this session and also serve as of-

ficial judge of the contest. Following the judging contest a showmanship practice will be held for all participants.

More than 100 of Clackamas County's 4-H rabbit club members are expected to attend the event.

Each 4-H member will receive a ribbon and vie for the opportunity to compete for a place on the team representing Clackamas County at State Fair.
