Stella Belle Brooks, Rt. 2 Box 427, Gresham, died July 18 at her home at age 84.

Born Stella Belle Hackworth at Millsprings, Mo., she spent her early years and schooling there. On Jan. 1, 1906, she married George Washington Brooks at Befork, Mo.

Drusilla M. Light, 59, of Rt. 2, Gresham, died in a Portland hospital July 15 after an extended illness.

Free handyman service available

There's free help available for senior citizens who could use some assistance with yard or household chores this summer.

The program, known as the Sandy Senior Center Summer Service Handyman Project, is being offered free of charge to senior citizens who need work done and can't afford to have it done or aren't able to do it themselves.

Gretchen Barzee, a field study student from the University of Oregon who is supervising the project, said that so far there haven't been many takers on the offer for free help.

Two area youths, Curtis Fox and Bob Moore, are serving as summer handymen as a result of funds made available through the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA).

"Trying to find work for them

is hard," Gretchen said. "People just aren't requesting help."

Gretchen has assigned the boys to a variety of tasks, including mowing lawns, weeding, washing cars and doing minor home repairs.

They are also available to undertake such projects as cleaning gutters, chopping wood or changing lightbulbs.

The Sandy Senior Center staff has requested that those who do take advantage of the work provide transportation for the handymen—if possible.

"That saves us a lot of legwork," Gretchen said. However, the staff will provide rides when other transportation can't be arranged.

Anyone over 55-years-old is eligible to take advantage of the handyman service by contacting Gretchen at the Sandy Senior Center, 668-5569.

Committee sets July 22 meeting

The Citizen Involvement Advisory Committee (CIAC) of the Land Conservation and Development Commission (LCDC) will hold its next meeting on July 22, 1977.

One of the purposes of the meeting will be to review the effectiveness of citizens involvement in comprehensive planning in the CRAG (Columbia River Association of Governments) area. Comments concerning citizen involvement in the CRAG region are welcome.

CIAC was created in 1973 by the state legislature. Its purpose is to insure citizen input in decision made by the LCDC, which was formed to coordinate comprehensive planning in the state.

CIAC is composed of 20 citizen members from throughout Oregon who make recommendations to the LCDC on a wide range of public issues. CIAC made several contributions to the wording of LCDC's citizens involvement goal.

CIAC regularly reviews city and county program to insure

that citizen's rights are being recognized throughout planning decisions. The committee is now seeking to identify both problems and successes in citizen involvement on planning programs.

In the July 22 meeting, citizen involvement in Sandy, Barlow, Molalla and other small towns in the CRAG region will be evaluated, along with an overall review of Clackamas County planning.

"We'll be looking at involvement," said Lloyd Chapman of the Oregon Department of Land Conservation and Development. "Part of the discussion will cover how the (LCDC) programs are being implemented."

Chapman added that Sandy is beginning a re-evaluation of its planning under a new federal planning grant program.

The CIAC committee meeting will begin a 9:30 a.m. at the CRAG office, 527 SW Hall St. in Portland. All interested citizens are invited to attend.

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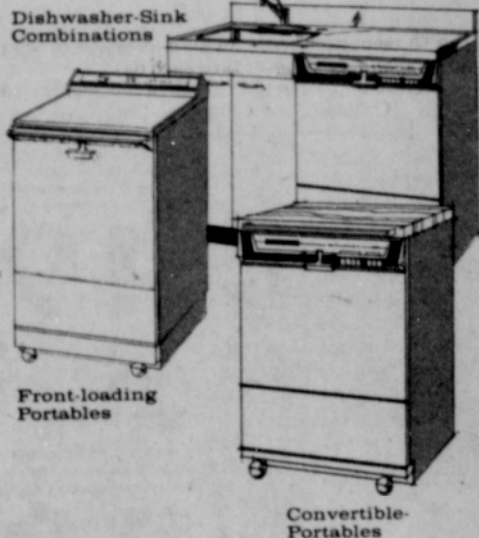


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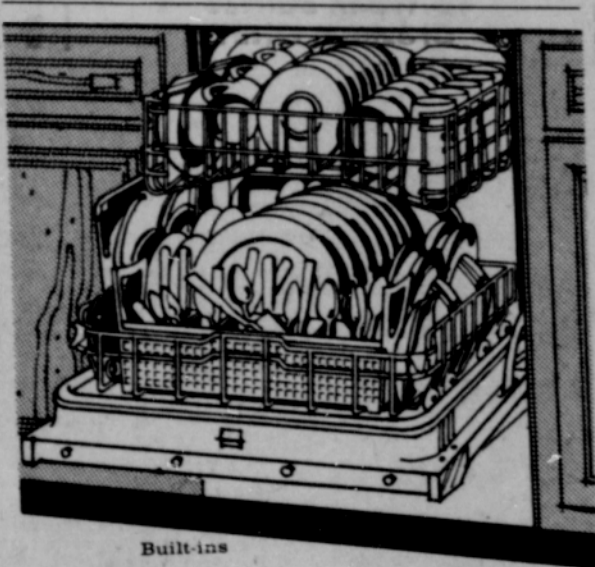
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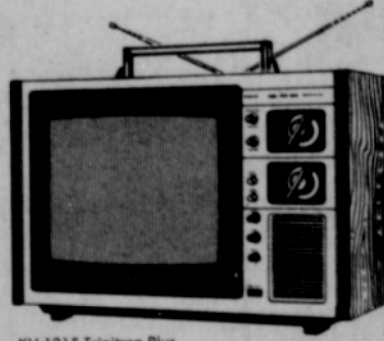
