

County health division sets immunization clinic in Sandy

An immunization clinic sponsored by the Clackamas County Public Health Division will be held on Thursday, April 20 at Firwood School.

"Although the State of Oregon requires that children have these immunizations prior to school enrollment, children are at a high risk from these diseases between the ages of 1 and 2," said Thomas M. Troxel, director of the public health division.

Cost for the immunization is \$3, but no will be denied

service due to an inability to pay, said Theresa Luhman of the health division. The clinic will be held from 2:30-5:30 p.m. at the school located off Firwood Road on 42900 SE Trubel Road.

No appointment is necessary, she added, but parents must bring records of previous immunizations. A parent or legal guardian is required to accompany children in order to sign a consent form.

Immunizations are a safe and effective way to help the body prevent or fight off

diseases which can cripple or kill, said Dr. John Schilke, Clackamas County health officer.

"There are seven diseases which every pre-schooler should be protected against," he added. "These are polio, measles, mumps and rubella (German or three-day measles), diphtheria, pertussis (whooping cough), and tetanus."

Schilke said immunizations for diphtheria, pertussis and tetanus (DPT) are given in combined doses as often as the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR). "An ideal schedule for beginning these immunizations starts with three

doses of DPT and polio within the first year of life, a booster of each at 1½ years and another before entering school," Schilke added.

Diphtheria and tetanus boosters are then given every 10 years. Measles and rubella immunizations are given sometime after the child reaches 15 months of age but before entering school.

Mumps vaccine is available and is usually given with the measles and rubella immunizations.

"Smallpox is no longer a routine immunization although it may be needed for international travel," Schilke said.

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Community school classes to start

Activities for spring term begin April 10 at Welches Community School. Classes are held at Welches Grade School located on Salmon River Road near Zigzag.

Many activities still have openings, according to Community School Coordinator Reva Cox. "If you were unable to register last week, you may register for these activities the first night

of class," she said.

A listing of the classes was sent to area residents. But those who might not have received one may contact the Sandy Community School.

The school is offering activities for all age groups. Classes are sponsored by Mt. Hood Community College, the Welches School District and the Welches Community School Council.

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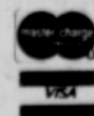
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
