Fruit trees may need pruning

The sudden arrival of spring has caught many home gardeners with their fruit trees unpruned. Apple and cherry trees are budding, plums are blooming. Some gardeners ask, "Should the fruit trees be

pruned anyway, or is it best to wait until next winter?"

"It's not too late to prune now, or anytime during the summer," says Gray Thompson, OSU Extension home gardening agent for Clackamas County.

True, pruning now will remove some fruit buds.

"But they would not be there now if pruning had been done earlier, so nothing is really lost," he adds.

Gardeners may want to delay pruning their cherry trees in order to enjoy the blooms. If so, Thompson

advises letting the cherries ripen and prune the tree at harvest time.

"That way you can pick the cherries more easily. Simply cut off the hard-to-reach branches and harvest the cherries with your feet on the ground," he says.
