Berry fertilizing tips told

Berries can be confusing when it comes to applying fertilizers, according to Gray Thompson, OSU Extension home gardening agent for Clackamas County.

For instance, established strawberry beds should not be fertilized in the spring. Strawberries are not heavy users of fertilizer in the beginning.

"A spring application of

fertilizer can cause too much vegetative growth and soft, pulpy berries," Thompson said. "Instead, strawberries should be fertilized in August, after the berry crop is finished for the year."

On the other hand, red and black raspberries and trailing berries need an application of fertilizer as soon as possible, he said. Fertilizing recommendations are as follows:

Red raspberries: 10-20-10 fertilizer (10 percent nitrogen, 20 percent phosphorus, 10 percent potassium), 3 cups per 100 square feet.

Black raspberries: 10-2-10 fertilizer, 2 1/2 cups per 100 square feet.

Marionberries, loganberries, and thornless evergreen blackberries: 10-20-10 fertilizer, 2 cups per 100 square feet.

Sandy Boy Scouts show 'Scout spirit'

Sandy Boy Scout Troop 176 returned from the Thunderbird Camporee April 8 and 9 at Oxbow Park with a first place award in participation and second place in "Scout spirit."

The meet involved 600 boys

in demonstrations of fire building, survival skills, backpacking, cooking and other camping skills.

The local troop demonstrated small animal traps and snares and how to make pole lashings.

During Scout Capades April 22 at the Fairview Dog Track, troop staff members will operate a "simulated computer" to answer the public's questions about first aid. Questions will be fed into the "computer" and staff will produce the correct answer.

Bear Patrol will demonstrate setting up a camp site and how to make lashings at Scout Capades, while Falcon Patrol will teach knot tying and uses for the various types of knots.

The three most recent advancements in Troop 176 include Shawn Burns to Tenderfoot and Roman Scott and Ralph Faust to Second Class.

Assistant Scoutmaster Mark Luebke recently was honored at a reception following his installation as an Eagle Scout last month. The Sam Barlow High School senior, who is a son of the Rev. and Mrs. John F. Luebke of Gresham, is the fourth boy to attain the Eagle rank within the troop.

Luebke, a former Lakeview, Ore., Scout, has been active in the Sandy Troop for 2 1/2 years. He earned a total of 24 merit badges and built a brick barbecue for Pleasant Home United Methodist Church as his Eagle project.

Attending Luebke's installation ceremonies in Sandy were Guy Miller, Columbia Pacific executive retired; Mike Drake, Boy Scout Thunderbird District executive, and Bob Alger, Luebke's former Scoutmaster from Lakeview.

Troop 176 Scoutmaster Bob Benson said only 1 percent of all Boy Scouts attain the Eagle rank, but a recent survey at the U.S. Air Force Academy indicated 15 percent of the cadets had held the rank.

The Sandy Scouts are known as a "camping troop" and are planning a backpacking trip for June, a camping trip to Mirror Lake in July, Scout summer camp at Camp Meriwether on the Oregon Coast Aug. 6-12, and a horseback camping trip in October.

In addition, the troop offers family activities throughout the year.

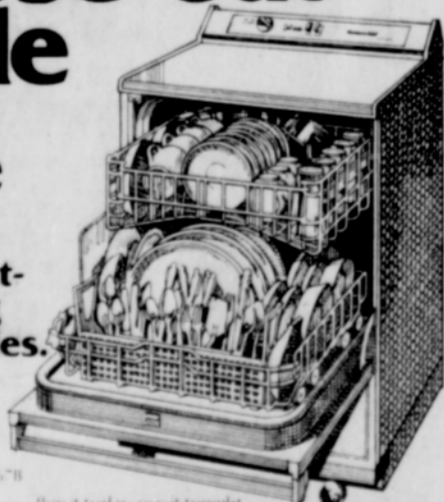
