CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES at the Boring Middle School as workers poured walls for the new band room being built there. Work should be completed in August. The project is financed with a \$697,000 bond issue approved last year.

Road resurfacing due near Government Camp

The Oregon State Highway Division has announced plans to resurface two sections of road in the Mt. Hood area near Government Camp.

The Clackamas County project calls for resurfacing of 5.31 miles of the Ski Bowl Frontage Road-Summit Meadow Road and the Warm Springs Interchange-Salmon River Curves sections of the Mt. Hood and Warm Springs Highways.

Advisory committee to meet

The citizens advisory committee of Firwood Neighbors Inc. will meet Monday, April 17 at 7:30 p.m. at the Firwood School library.

A spokesman for the highway division said the paving width will vary from 32 to 77 feet. Completion time is 110 calendar workdays. The Oregon Transportation Commission will receive bids for the 26 projects on Thursday, April 27. Estimated cost for the entire package is \$7,600,000.

Anyone with conditional use requests or zone changes with Clackamas County or having questions about building or placing mobile homes on property is invited to attend the meeting. Meeting topics will include review and discussion of all applications on hand, according to Barbara Boswell.
