More than 19,000 new, single family, apartment and mobile home customers were added to PGE lines during 1977. This residential growth exceeded all previous years in the company's history. Nearly 60 percent of these new customers have chosen electric heat — an important indication of the need for adding generating capacity.



Trojan Led Nation

The Trojan nuclear power plant turned in a powerfully good performance for PGE customers during 1977 providing more than one-third of the electricity they required. The plant was on line 75 percent of the time and generated a net total of 6.5 billion kilowatt-hours during the year. It outperformed all of the other 66 commercial nuclear plants in the U.S. in five of the months from December 1976 through November 1977.

Self-cleaning Ovens
Save Energy

Due to special, heavier insulation, self-cleaning ovens typically require only about 85 percent as much electricity as the equivalent conventional oven to maintain the temperature set for normal cooking operations. If you were to clean your self-cleaning oven once each month, the high efficiency of the unit in baking and roasting would more than offset the added cost of the cleaning cycle — which is about 10¢.

A non-farm use permit request for land in the Firwood area will go before the Clackamas County Hearings Officer tonight at 7 p.m.

Russell A. Niemeyer has asked to adjust the lot lines between two tax lots so the first lot will be 1.7 acres in size and the second lot will be 4.4 acres in size. The second lot would then be sold.

An existing mobile home would be located on the 1.7 acre parcel and an existing conventional home on the 4.4 acre site.

The present zoning is EFU-20, exclusive farm use. The land is located on the east side of Firwood Road, immediately north of its intersection with Bornstedt Road in the Sandy area.

Sandy business booms, as more
merchants scramble for space

Business is booming in Sandy.

Or so the amount of new businesses would indicate. There's a new Foto Mat in the works, plus a major new clothing department store, a card shop, another title company office, a new senior center, plus plenty of expansion and remodeling.

Since the advent of the City's Design Review Board May 27, 1976, some 63 parties have established new business offices here or made plans for offices in Sandy.

New buildings include the many shops housed in the new Wheatland Building and adjoining Radar Building behind T.J.'s restaurant.

These include a new health food store, a catalog center, a sports shop, a clothing boutique, a jewelry store, and a hair styling salon.

Westland Realty is remodeling to include an addition for a new Safeco Title office.

Oregon Trail plans to remodel its local building, too, as does Sandy Funeral building with plans for a new chapel.

The city has purchased the Baptist church downtown to remodel for a senior center downstairs and as new home for the city's building department upstairs.

There's a proposed new building on University for Kehrli & Swanson and new buildings planned for the city's industrial park for shops for Jim Turrin and Ray Thornberg.

A new veterinary clinic may be in the works.

The proposed Foto-Mat film drop would be located on the southwest corner of Williams' Thriftway.

Karl McDermid plans a new building next to Country Deli on Proctor and Sandy Decor eyes a move to the Old Valberg building across from Thriftway.

The Kehrli & Swanson

building will be a two-story rental building of offices and shops.

Recent new stores or businesses include Western Tip Shoe Repair, Sandy Decor Center and Creative Draperies.

Tim Kasch has a new two-story building.

Calico Country welcomes new owners Arlene and Don Stuck, as Don Obrist plans an industrial garage.

Griff's Longburger is remodeling for an upstairs dining area with a mountain view, and others remodeling or recently remodeled include Carlson Chevrolet Body Shop, Cedar Plaza, T.J.s, Coast to Coast, Janz Berryland and Sandy Rexall Drug.

Quarter Master is a new business with games and amusements, and other new businesses or buildings in the past two years include Richardson's Realty, Tri County Electric, Westland Realty, Le-Bon Petit, Glos Ford's sales office, the Pioneer Square complex, Winter Fox, C & L Remodeling, Sandy Saddle Shop, Mt. Hood Dairy Queen, Babe's Big Boy Pizza, Decker's, Sandy Post building, Country Deli, Something Blue, B & B Emporium, Landa Rentals, and Coast to Coast.

Several businesses have relocated within the downtown sector as quarters are expanded, in a scramble that finds prime store frontage in existing construction in growing short supply.

A LANDMARK REMODELED

Gordon Stone plans to open

his new men's and women's clothing store around the middle of May in the former Sandy Market, built in 1938 by Hoffman Bros.

Sandy's original supermarket specialized in meats. The building has been completely remodeled since September with a December layoff.

The building was completely gutted and remodeled inside, with center focus the existing skylight and spiraling tower, which Stone has built around for strong interior lighting.

A row of 6 x 6 posts lead skyward to the skylight, and a collar was hung around the tower to capitalize on the unique construction.

Side windows were sealed off, and a corner entry was added.

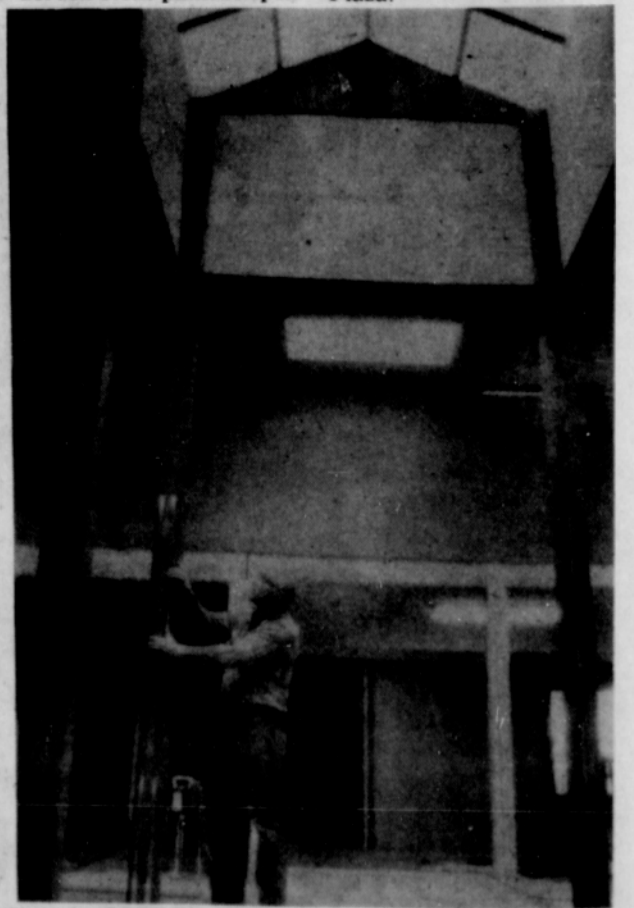
Stone plans cedar paneling on top of the building and more finish work on the bottom of the building's exterior.

Inside will be a ladies' boutique separated by an overhanging rail, and a Hallmark Card shop as an in-store separate business of some 1,000 square feet of floor space.

Burton Walrad will operate the card shop along with Stone.

The clothing and shoe store itself will hold some 4500 square feet of open floor space.

Former tenants in recent past include Sandy Country Florist which has since relocated on Pioneer, Blushing Zebra since relocated and Dr. Sah who has since bought Cedar Plaza.
