Two area men finish course

Two area residents are among 14 paramedics in the first class of the new advanced paramedic training program at the University of Oregon Health Science Center. The two, Douglas Cassidy of Boring and Jerry D. Towns of Sandy, have received certificates after completing a six-month training program.

Cassidy, son of Franklin M. Cassidy of Stone Road in Boring, is a 1966 graduate of Sandy Union High School and attended Mt. Hood Community College. He is employed by Port of Portland Airport Fire Department. Towns is the son of Mr. and Mrs. John M. Towns of Gresham and is a former

employee of Alpine Ambulance in Sandy. He will also be employed by the Port of Portland Airport Fire Department.

The new program, funded through a three-year grant from the Collins Foundation, began in October, 1977. Students in the first class came from Central Point, West Linn, Boring, Scappoose, Astoria, Corbett, Sandy, and Portland.

The students, 12 men and two women, just returned from a five week in-the-field internship with the Los Angeles City Fire Department, where they worked with certified senior paramedics to practice and perfect their medical skills.

In Los Angeles, they also had experience using medical control communications, which involves paramedics in the field communicating with emergency room physicians for assistance in patient evaluation, tentative diagnosis and treatment. The hospital emergency rooms they worked with included Harbor General (which provides the background for "Rampart" in the popular television "Emergency program"), University of California at Los Angeles, Los Angeles County-University of Southern California, Queen of Angels and Daniel Freeman.

Every six months, the

UOHC program trains 14 paramedics from fire departments, ambulance companies, and hospital emergency rooms to meet national standards for certification as an advanced (III) level emergency medical technician.

The program is based on the nationally approved paramedic program developed by the U.S. Department of Transportation.
