

Stroke claims Judge Mulvey

Clackamas County District Judge Robert M. Mulvey died of a stroke Tuesday in his home in Oregon City. The 63-year-old judge was seeking re-election in November.

Mulvey's death leaves Robert Burns unopposed in November's election unless petitions for nomination are filed with the secretary of state's office by Aug. 29. The 37-year-old Burns is the Clackamas County deputy district attorney.

Mulvey entered Willamette Falls Hospital last month for testing of an

undisclosed ailment. He underwent heart surgery in February 1973.

Mulvey is survived by his wife, Elizabeth, Oregon City; two sons, Michael, Salem, and Patrick, Whittier, Calif.; a daughter, Marcia, Portland; and a brother, Charles, Seaview, Wash.

Vigil service will be at 8 p.m. Thursday in Hillside Chapel, Oregon City. Requiem Mass will be at 2 p.m. Friday at St. John the Apostle Church, followed by interment at St. John Cemetery, Oregon City.



Dodge victim of vandalism

THIS RED CAR found its final resting place Tuesday night in the Sandy River at Dodge Park. Witnesses said the car, apparently wrecked before it was dumped into the river, was pushed through the sand into the water. The park has been the target of vandalism in recent weeks, said a caretaker. She said several picnic tables were also destroyed Tuesday night and thrown into the river. table) a night," she added. "When they get through with those, where are they going to sit?" The caretaker asked that park users who see vandalism report it to the sheriff's department. The recent damage is under investigation by the Clackamas County Sheriff's Department. Dodge Park is operated by the City of Portland.

Weeks to head signature drive

Canby Realtor Duane Weeks has been named chairman of the Clackamas signature drive for the Land Use Planning Constitutional Amendment Committee (LUPCAC), according to Fremont McComb, chairman of the political action group.

LUPCAC is seeking to obtain 62,000 signatures on its petition in the tri-county area by July 7. The drive is

part of a statewide effort to nullify the 19 long range goals of the Land Conservation Development Commission (LCDC).

If passed, the amendment would require that future goals and state laws applying to land use be adopted by the Legislature. It would also require that landowners be notified by mail before a local government could rezone their land.

Committee to work on comprehensive plan

The Sandy Citizens Advisory Committee will hold another in a series of meetings on revising the five year Comprehensive Plan for the City of Sandy Wednesday, June 28, at city hall.

The committee has held monthly meetings since September on revising the plan and will submit a final
