

Caring for your far away plants

Going on vacation and can't find a "sitter" for your houseplants? You can make a "home greenhouse" to care for most of them says Ray McNeilan, Home Horticulture Extension Agent.

Most houseplants will keep nicely if you layer several thicknesses of newspaper on a plastic drop cloth, put the plants in the tub and turn on the shower long enough to wet the leaves, soil and newspaper. Then pull the

shower curtain and drape another plastic drop cloth over the top, attaching one edge to the back wall with tape to form a greenhouse sort of tent.

Leave the light on in the bathroom and your plants should be in top shape when you get back from vacation.

No plant storage method is perfect and it would be wise to have someone stop by to check the more valuable plants from time to time during your absence.

Spray not in use

The Forest Service will not use chemical spray to control an outbreak of western spruce budworm in the forests of north-central Washington, it was announced today by R.E. (Dick) Worthington, regional forester.

The decision was based on biological data that shows a gradual decline in insect egg masses, and the possibility the outbreak may substantially decrease before this fall. Forest Service personnel will monitor the spruce budworm populations throughout the summer, followed by intensive egg mass surveys this fall, to

Damage by the budworm is apparent to anyone visiting the area. The budworm larvae feed on buds and needles, turning the normally green foliage to a rusty brown or red. Areas heaviest damage are in the Okanogan and Wenatchee National Forests, and on North Cascades National Park, state and private lands in the area.

Worthington's decision comes a month after the filing of a 1978 final environmental statement with the Environmental Protection Agency on May 18.

Rhododendron bushes ready for spraying

Rhododendrons are due for insect control measures. Root weevils begin to emerge in early June and continue through the summer.

"The adults feed on leaves, producing a notched effect around the edge of the leaf," says Gray Thompson, Oregon State University Extension agent.

The adults can cause heavy damage to rhododendrons. But the worst threat comes from the root weevil larvae which feed on the roots. The adults lay eggs in the soil around the crown of the plants and when the larvae hatch, they work down to the roots.

Although the larval form is the worst culprit, control of the root weevil is directed only against the adult. Orthene, malathion 5-percent dust, or liquid concentrate diazinon are recommended.

Orthene should be applied immediately and again in July, August and September. Orthene works as a systemic as well as by contact. The insecticide is taken in by the

plant and continues to combat weevils after the chemical has disappeared from the leaf surface.

Malathion 5-percent dust or liquid concentrate diazinon should be applied immediately and again in July and August. Follow label directions.

"Apply the insecticides in the late evening, if possible. Adult weevils feed at night so the chemical should be more effective then," says Thompson.

None of the insecticides are registered for root or soil treatment. Soaking a solution of orthene in the ground has damaged rhododendron plants.

"Destroying the adults means fewer eggs will be laid. That's why it is important to start weevil control as soon as the adults emerge," Thompson says.

No insecticides are recommended for control of the larval form that lives in the soil. Products previously used against weevil larvae have been withdrawn from the market.

EXPLANATION: To meet the needs of students, make quality career education and training available to residents of the District, and to meet costs resulting from inflation, the Board of Education of the Mt. Hood Community College District finds this levy necessary.

Approval of this measure would provide funding which would allow the college to maintain services next year caring for necessary cost increases. This one-year levy does not provide for buildups.

With approval of this measure, the operating budget to be financed by local taxes for the fiscal year 1978-79 will be \$1,027,880 greater than the operating budget financed by local taxes for the preceding year.

The Board calculates at this time that there will be no increase in the current tax rate of \$2.20 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. Therefore, the total tax on a \$30,000 home, if valued the same as the current year, will be \$66 or less.
