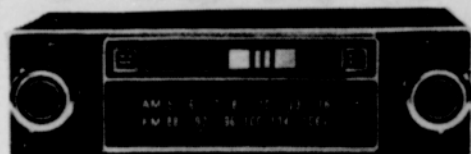


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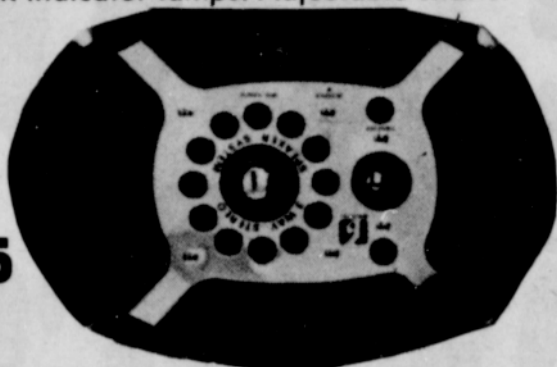
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Pets to parade

Last year's show included everything from dogs and cats to a horned toad and a miniature horse.

"We'll have fun with it," said Mrs. Sheppard, who promises that everyone will go home with some recognition.

to that youngster."
