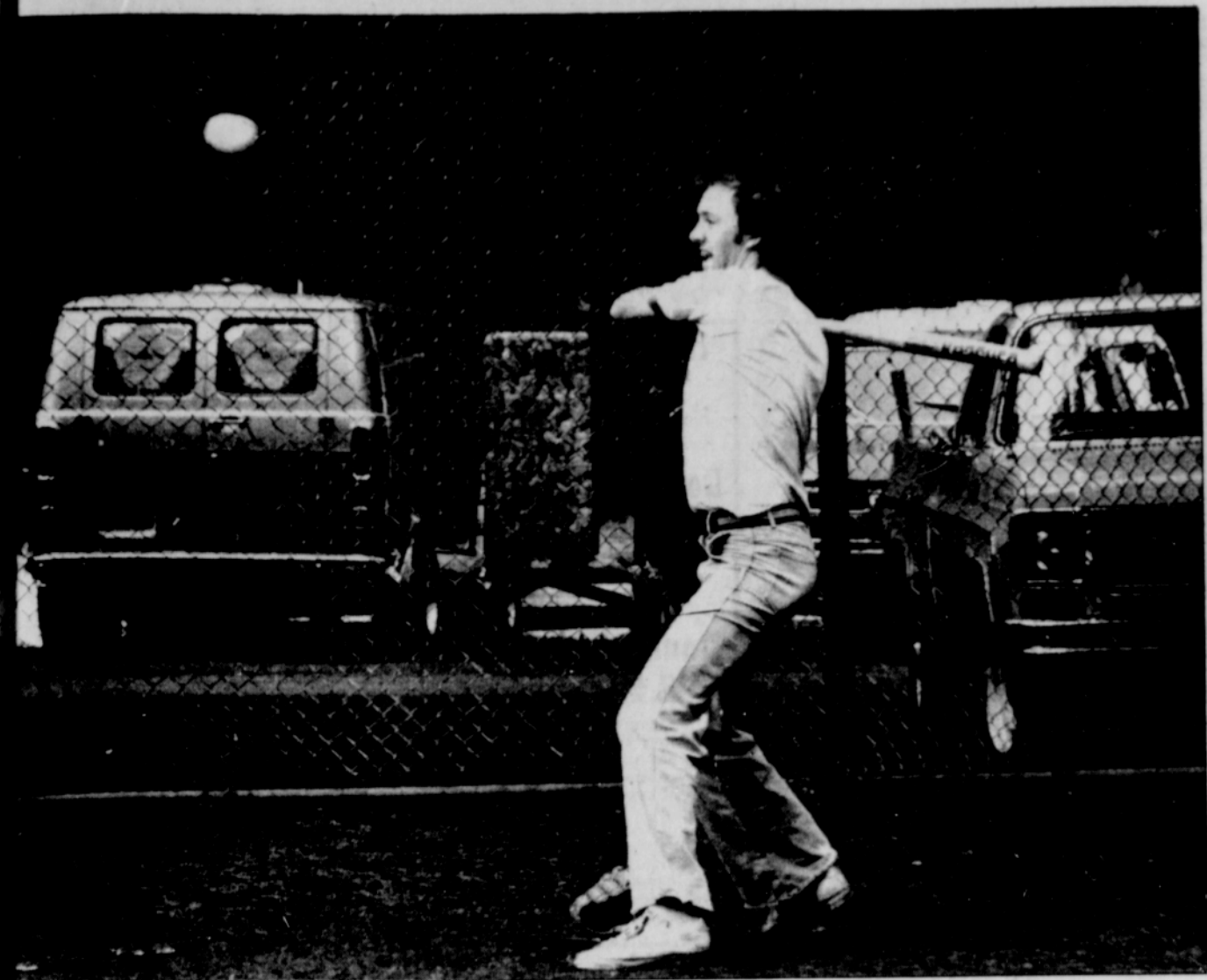




Fourth of July at Roslyn Lake

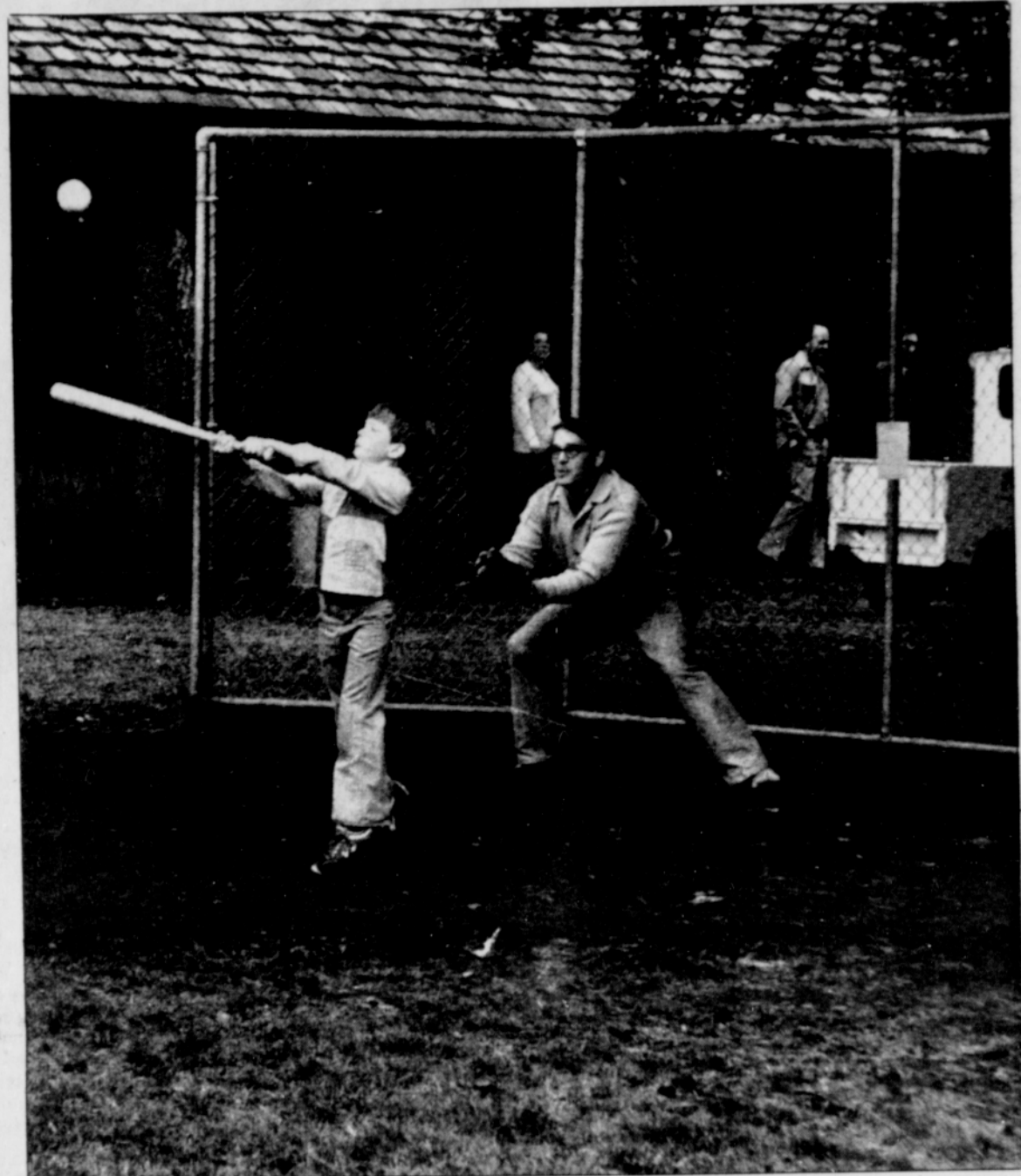
Boat rentals were at a maximum, but no one

Forest Service offers Timberline Lodge tours

The U.S. Forest Service is sponsoring a series of activities at Timberline Lodge this summer, including tours, hikes, demonstrations and exhibits.

Tours of Timberline Lodge will be held daily from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Long nature walks are tentatively scheduled to leave the lodge at 2 p.m. The

walks will take 1-2 hours and cover up to three miles or longer, depending on requests.

Hike destinations are Zigzag Canyon, White River Canyon and Silcox Hut, which is at the end of the original Magic Mile chairlift. Silcox is now used as a warm-up hut for climbers.

Short nature walks will be leaving Timberline every hour beginning at 10:30 a.m. The walks take a half-hour and are designed to ac-

comodate anyone, including persons on crutches or in wheelchairs, according to seasonal naturalist Karn Stiegelmeier.

Evening programs will be held at Timberline Lodge and at some campgrounds around the Mt. Hood Forest. The programs will be held Saturday evenings at Timberline Lodge and Green Canyon Campgrounds, Friday evenings at Camp Creek Campground and Friday and Saturday evenings at Trillium Lake

Campground. Exact times for the programs will vary with location and time of the summer.

"The programs will cover all kinds of things," Stiegelmeier said. "There will be topics on various aspects of the mountain such as geology, fire ecology and local flora and fauna."

The Forest Service also hopes to conduct demonstrations and exhibits a little later in the summer. The demonstrations would cover pioneer skills such as handling the broadaxe and adze, and the exhibits would cover native flora and fauna, among other things. Schedules for these activities will be announced later.

Times for the evening programs, demonstrations and long walks are subject to change. Stiegelmeier advises calling for information before making any plans.

The Forest Service runs an information booth at Timberline which can be reached by calling 272-3311, extension 317. Information can also be

obtained by calling the Zigzag Ranger Station.

"The U.S. Forest Service activities are available for local people as well as tourists passing through," Stiegelmeier said. "I'd like to encourage everyone that lives here to use them, particularly the campground program."

Clinic slated

A two-week gymnastics clinic will be held at Sandy Union High School July 17-21 and 24-28.

Sandy High gymnastics coach Laura Pihlaja-Muehleck will conduct the sessions which will be held in four skill levels.

Beginners will work out from 9-10 a.m.; intermediates from 11 a.m.-1 p.m.; and advanced from 1-3:30 p.m.

The clinic is open to male and female gymnasts, but class size is limited to 12 persons for each level. Instruction will be provided in floor exercise, vaulting, the balance beam and the uneven parallel bars.

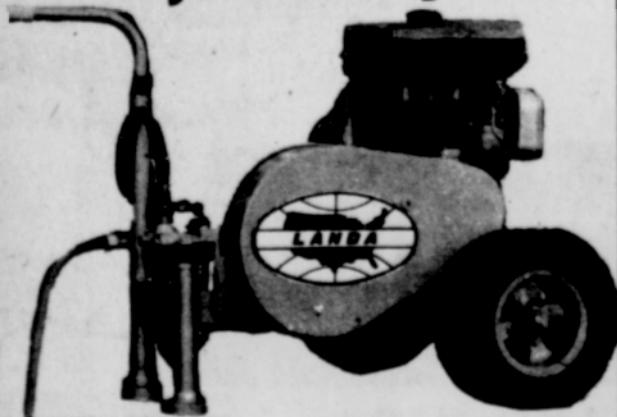
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
