

8 youth agencies coordinate efforts

Johnny X, a 15-year old high school dropout, was caught stealing a pack of cigarettes from a grocery store. He was found guilty in Juvenile Court and was put on probation for a year.

Two weeks before that incident, he got into a fight with a companion and broke his arm.

Johnny has an emotional problem. He comes from a broken family and receives very little support from his mother or father.

How can the community in which Johnny lives help him?

That question was on the minds of eight Clackamas county youth agency representatives who got together for a brainstorming session last week. The main topic for discussion was how

to coordinate the resources the agencies have to keep Johnny from getting into trouble.

The organization heads agreed to develop a communications and referral network within the county to coordinate the broad range of services available to clients.

Marshal Watkins, of the Clackamas County Education Service District (formerly IED) and Dian Connett, alternative school specialist for ESD were instrumental in getting the workshop organized.

In the past, agency representatives have found that the problems involved in working together were almost greater than the problems they had to solve with the youths.

When a youngster breaks a law, several agencies may be called in to deal with the problem. "Sometimes an agency doesn't know what the others are doing and end up working at cross purposes," Watkins said.

"The big advantage of the network concept is that agencies will be able to coordinate efforts and find solutions faster and more efficiently," he added.

Eight county youth organizations were represented at the workshop. They included: The Clackamas Mental Health Department, Children's Services Division, the Juvenile Court, Youth Adventures, the Youth Commission, North Clackamas School District,

the Kendall Youth Program and the ESD.

The eight agencies agreed to begin organizing a network, Connett said. "In three months we plan to evaluate the system to see if it's doing what we intend it to do," she

added.

Several other county youth organizations, such as Youth Alternatives, CETA, YMCA, and Community Action have also been contacted and are interested in working with the network.
