Mt. Hood Forest is well protected

Mt. Hood National Forest covers thousands of acres and took years to develop. But it could all be gone with a careless match.

To help protect the forest, fire management offices have been set up in the seven U.S. Forest Service districts in Mt. Hood National Forest. Though each district can fight only relatively small fires, the combined forces of those and other districts are impressive, according to Zigzag Ranger Station's Fire Management Officer Roger Van Buskirk.

"The U.S. Government has an awesome amount of power they can put to work in the fire suppression game," Van Buskirk said. "It's second only to the military."

"For instance, we could put 3,000 people in full operation on any given spot in the state of Oregon in 10 hours," he explained. "By full operation, I mean food, camp facilities, fire-fighting equipment, the whole works."

The Zigzag Ranger District has the highest number of public user-days in the Northwest. But despite the number of visitors to this section of Mt. Hood National Forest, relatively few fires have been reported.

The area had several small fires and one major disaster. Two hundred acres burned in

that fire. Employees at the Zigzag Ranger Station spend a considerable amount of time on fire prevention work.

"We put alot of effort into fire prevention," Van Buskirk said. "Some of the other areas in the Northwest had a lot of damage from fires, especially in northern California."

Among the preventive work done by the Zigzag employees was the clearing of slash left by logging operations and the restriction of open fires during the critical months of the summer. Despite the restrictions, none of the camping facilities in the forest were closed.

"We at Mt. Hood believe the forest is to be used by the people," Van Buskirk said. "During the drought last year, we closed all open fires in the whole forest and it worked pretty well."

Use of campstoves replaced open fires last year. One reason that restricting open fires was successful is that abandoned campfires are the leading cause of man-made fires. Another major cause is the use of fireworks.

"The Fourth of July always causes fire problems," Van Buskirk said. "It's illegal to shoot off fireworks in the National Forest but people do anyway."

New owner opens old Summit House

When Bob Brock bought into the Summit House in Government Camp recently, the cafe door was nailed shut and dinner hadn't been served in over nine years.

Two months later, the kitchen has been reopened to serve breakfast and lunch, and last Wednesday the new dinner menu was introduced to the public.

A new dining room and

kitchen are the main features of remodeling done to the oldest commercial building in Government Camp. Another feature is the addition of a sports shop.

"We remodeled where they used to sell cross-country skis into a sports shop," Brock said. "Now we sell retail — hiking equipment, clothing and cross country skis."

Study to focus on Barlow Trail

The Forest Service at Zigzag is accepting contract bids for an extensive study of the Barlow Trail to be conducted later this year.

A contract for the study will be let in late July or early August, according to Keith Thurkill, Cultural Resource Technician at the Zigzag Ranger Station.

Plans are for the project to be conducted in three phases: an historian will compile available literature concerning the Barlow Trail; aerial photographs will be made of the trail; and field specialists will work to unearth and record physical evidence of the trail.

The finished report will be a detailed study of the condition of the trail and its historical significance.

A number of archaeological study groups have been contacted by Forest Service to bid on the project. They include private consulting firms and academic institutions.

The deadline for sub-

mitting bids on the work is July 18.

The project is part of the Forest Service's Cultural Resources Management program.

Rhododendron accident site for two men

Two Portland men were injured in a single-car accident Sunday on U.S. 26 three miles east of Rhododendron.

The driver, Larry Jay Welch, told Clackamas County sheriff's deputies he swerved to avoid hitting a herd of deer on the road and was unable to regain control, running the car into a pile of dirt and rocks on the side of the road. Deputies reported the car was totaled.

Neither Welch nor a passenger, Ronald Alan Baker, sustained serious injuries.

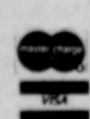
