



## Food and airplanes spice Kiwanis Fly-in

Rain failed to dampen the spirits of the 1,100 people attending the Kiwanis Fly-in Breakfast at Rich's Airport last weekend, although it did cut down on some of the activities planned.

Most things went according to schedule, however, as people chowed down for a worthy cause. Pancakes, eggs, ham, juice and coffee were consumed, and according to Sandy Kiwanis Club Treasurer Don Deming, "everybody seemed satisfied and there were a lot that came back for refills."

The aerobic display was cancelled due to the bad weather, but 191 people took advantage of the airplane rides offered by local pilots.

Other folks that remained grounded

took the opportunity to look at antique cars and airplanes and to listen and watch some of the music and films offered.

No figures were available as to how much the charity breakfast raised, but things went as well as could be expected considering the conditions, Deming said.

A number of pilots from around the state flew into the breakfast, although the figure was cut short from last year's total due to the rain.

This was the 21st year the Kiwanis Club has held the breakfast and ironically it is the first year it has rained.
