

College registration open for summer term

The second five-week session of summer classes at Mt. Hood Community College begins Monday, July 23, and continues through Friday, Aug. 25.

Registration for the second session is open 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, in the admissions and records office on the college's Gresham campus.

Over 100 class sections are offered to students attending the second session. Courses are available in programs varying from automotive and business education through forestry and mass communications to science and welding.

The summer term class offerings provide the student with summer flexibility. General academic class offerings are concentrated in the mornings with special interest, activity and students. Non high school graduates over the age of 18 whose high school class has graduated may also be admitted as regular students.

High school juniors and seniors may be admitted as special students with written authorization from their high school principal.

Non-high school graduates under 18 who are not attending high school may be admitted as special students with written authorization from the director of the MHCC admissions and records office.

All students registering for nine credit hours or more must apply for admission to the college.

A mixture of the two is offered in the evening for those unable to attend classes during the day. Also, the summer session offers a day and evening program in basic education courses for those needing to brush up on reading, writing, and mathematics.

The Maywood Park Center, located at 10100 NE Prescott, also offers traditional courses plus an array of self-paced instructional courses during

the second five-week session.

Admission requirements for the summer session are the same as for the regular fall, winter and spring terms.

Graduates of an accredited high school or GED certificate program may be admitted as regular students.

High school juniors and seniors may be admitted as special students with written authorization from their high school principal.

Non-high school graduates under 18 who are not attending high school may be admitted as special students with written authorization from the director of the MHCC admissions and records office.

Grant paves way for parking lot

A small portion of a \$2,147,000 block grant awarded to Clackamas County will be heading Sandy's way.

The main recipient of the Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) grant will be the Sandy Community Center. A total of \$9500 has been allocated for the planning and construction of a paved parking lot behind the center.

Work on the project won't begin until the county completes its environmental assessments for HUD, according to Community Development specialist Kim Manley. She added that work on the parking lot would

hopefully begin in October.

The only other money slated for Sandy area residents may come in the form of housing rehabilitation loans and grants, according to David Cooper, administrative assistant for Clackamas County Housing and Community Development.

The county has allocated \$190,000 for the housing repairs, and the amount Sandy residents will receive depends on the number who apply for the loans and grants.

Details on how to apply for the aid are in the process of being worked out and will be made public at a later date, Cooper said.
