County fair activities set

Puppets and performing animals will share the spotlight in childrens' entertainment at this year's Clackamas County Fair, Tuesday through Sunday, Aug. 15-20, reports Audri Cotton, entertainment director for the fair. In addition, a full schedule of adult entertainment will make the fairgrounds outdoor stage a major attraction for those attending the six-day event.

The Candyland Circus, starring Rowdy - the Wonder Pony, a troupe of acrobatic dogs, a mischievous monkey, and Gismo, the circus clown, is scheduled for afternoon and evening performances Tuesday through Saturday, with a concluding show Sunday afternoon.

Of special appeal to the younger set will be a puppet show slated for afternoon performances Tuesday through Saturday. The show is being produced by Carolyn Proehl of Applesed Productions, a music teacher at Howard Eccles Grade School in Canby.

The Clackamas County Talent Contest, a popular drawing card at past fairs, will be held on the outdoor stage, starting at 8 p.m. Wednesday evening, Aug. 16. Talent from all parts of the region will compete in two

age groups — one for those 14 and over, the other for those under 14. Prizes of \$75, \$50, and \$25 will be awarded the older age winners, with \$30, \$20, and \$10 going to the top under-14 performers.

In addition to the winners selected by the judges, an over-all "People's Choice" selection will be made by the audience itself. The performer so chosen will receive a trophy from the Clackamas County Fair Board.

An open talent show for youngsters will be held Tuesday, opening day of the fair, from noon til 2:15 p.m.

A new feature of the fair is a "Disco Party" scheduled for 8 p.m. Saturday night, Aug. 19. Light and sound will be provided by Merlyn's Disco Productions of Portland. "Cock and Bull", a country rock band, will perform Tuesday through Saturday. Other bands scheduled for the six-day fair include Cascade Freedom (Tuesday night), the Gresham Hotshots (senior citizens kitchen band, Thursday afternoon), and CC & His Lady (country western band, Thursday night).

The Old-Time Fiddlers will be back again this year with members of the Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Association participating from all parts of the state. Among the prominent fiddlers on hand will be Carol Ann Wheeler, the state's champion old-time fiddler and second-place winner in the women's division of the national competition held recently in

Weiser, Idaho. The Old Time Fiddlers will give two shows Friday, Aug. 18 — one in the afternoon, the other in the evening.

Dance performances will be given by Maralee's Dancers Wednesday noon, Friday evening and Saturday noon; by the Pat & Bob Revue, Friday evening; by the Lisa Shear Dance Studio and the Portland Gymnastic Studio, Saturday afternoon; and by the Remarkable Ralphettes, a Hawaiian revue, Sunday evening.

The Senior Shufflers, a senior square dance group will be on stage Thursday noon and 4-H square dancers, the Mini-Squares, will perform Sunday afternoon.

Songs by folksinger Gary Anderson will be featured Sunday noon and evening and ventriloquist Jim Beisell will put on a show Thursday at 6 p.m. Performances will be presented by the Canby Drama Club Thursday afternoon and Sunday evening. The Canby Christian Church will present a program Sunday at 1:15 p.m.

The 4-H coronation ceremonies will be held Tuesday evening, Aug. 15, starting at 7 p.m. and the 4-H Fashion Show will be presented Thursday evening at 8.

Shows will run continuously from noon till late evening each day of the six-day fair, Mrs. Cotton says. The stage, she adds, has been moved to a shadier location on the grounds and improved lighting and sound equipment has been installed.

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Entertainment and the arts

Classic Films

The Portland Art Museum's Northwest Film Study Center is showing several classic films within the next ten days. They include:

"Way Down East", on Thursday, Aug. 3 at 8 p.m. Lillian Gish and Richard Barthelmess star in this story about an unwed mother who is evicted by her landlord. D.W. Griffith shot this drama in 1920 on his estate in New York.

"Seven Chances", on Saturday, Aug. 5 at 2 p.m. In this 1925 comedy, Buster Keaton plays a man who is told one day that he can inherit a fortune if he marries by 7 p.m.

"Triumph of the Will", on Sunday, Aug. 6 at 8 p.m. This was filmed in Germany in 1934-36 by Leni Reifenstahl, hired by Hitler to document the 6th Nazi Party Congress in Nuremberg. The result is a powerful propaganda film that provides insight into the early Nazi regime; and

"Open City", on Sunday, Aug. 6 at 8 p.m. Roberto Rossellini made this film in Italy at the close of World War II, basing the story on the memoirs of an anti-fascist priest. The movie is a blend of fiction and newsreel-like camerawork that set a trend in post-war film making.

The film center is located at the museum, Southwest Park and Madison streets in Portland.

Wood Carvings

Portland artist Leopold Lambo will exhibit approximately 100 of his wood carvings in the Hall of the Northwest at the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry (OMSI) July 29 through Aug. 27. The 72-year-old Lambo was born in Rumania and came to Portland in 1950. His work has been displayed in Rumania, Austria, France and several local exhibitions.

Local Actors Performing

The Cabell Center for the Performing Arts, at Catlin Gabel School in southwest Portland, is sponsoring a production of "The Tavern", George M. Cohen's first play. Among the cast are Kurt Brewster, a junior at Sandy High School, Ernie Lafky, brother of The Post's former editor, Sue Lafky. The performance is scheduled for Tuesday, Aug. 1 at 8 p.m. (See story elsewhere in section two of this issue.).
