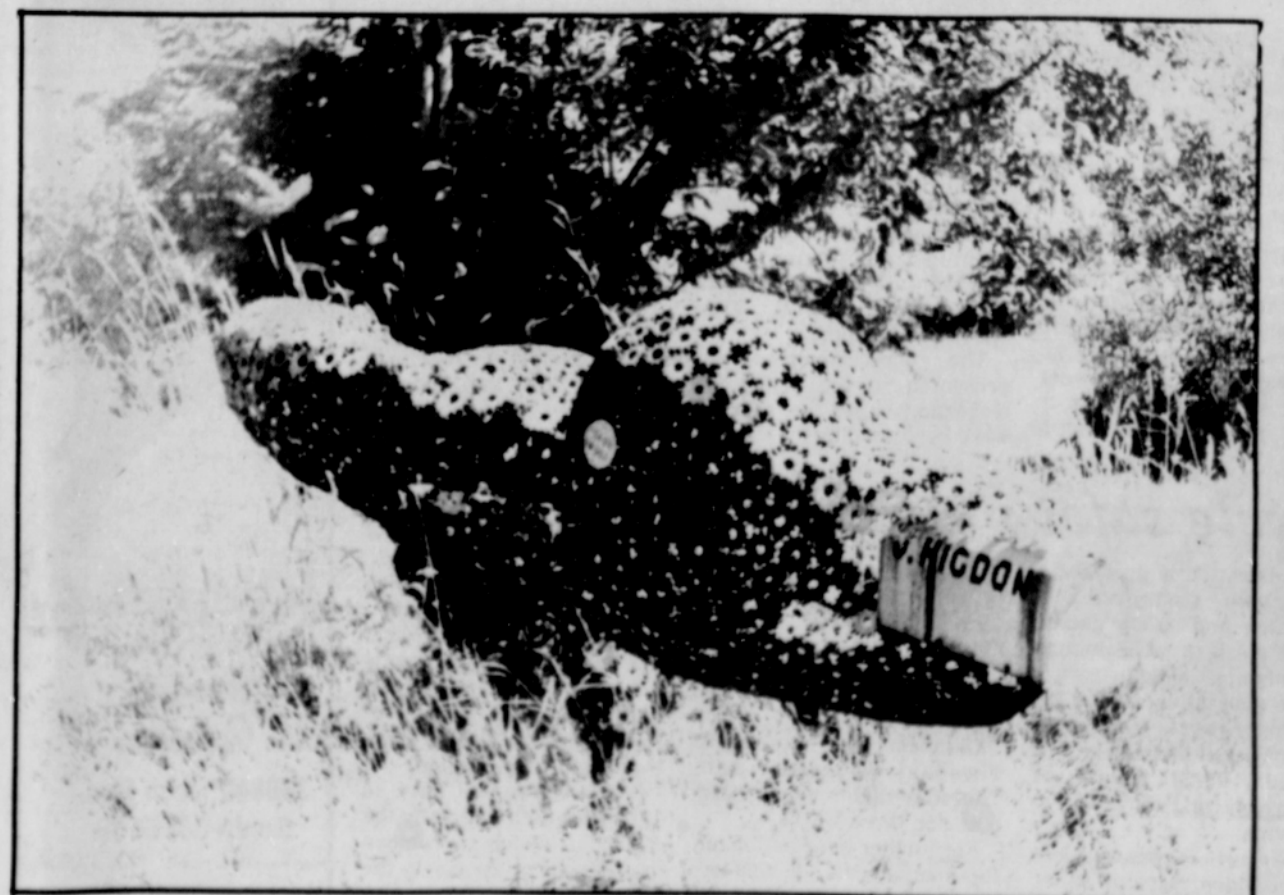
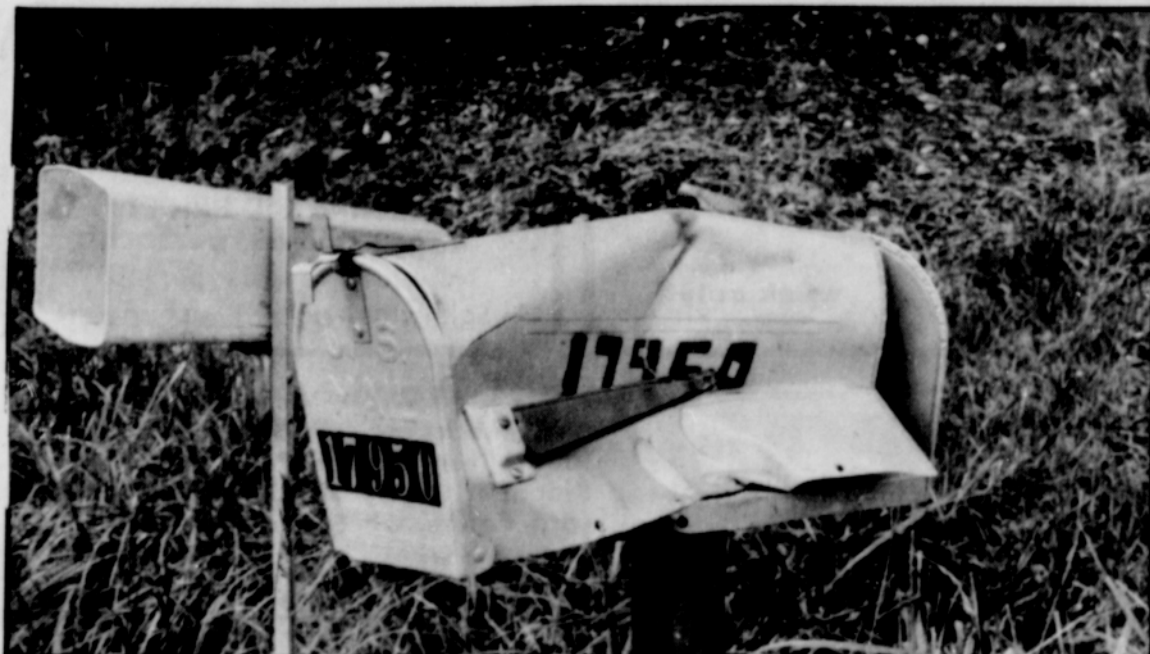
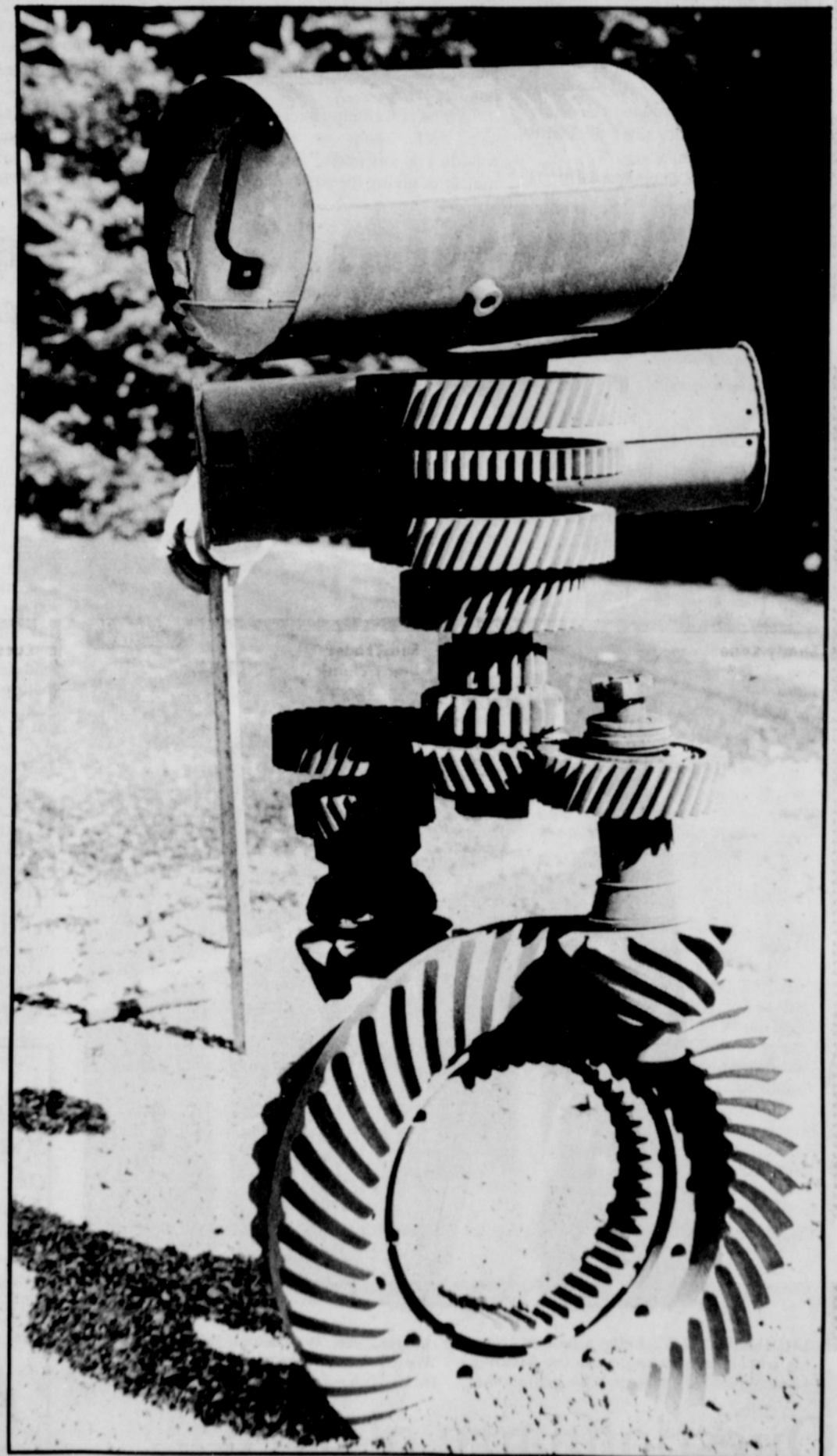
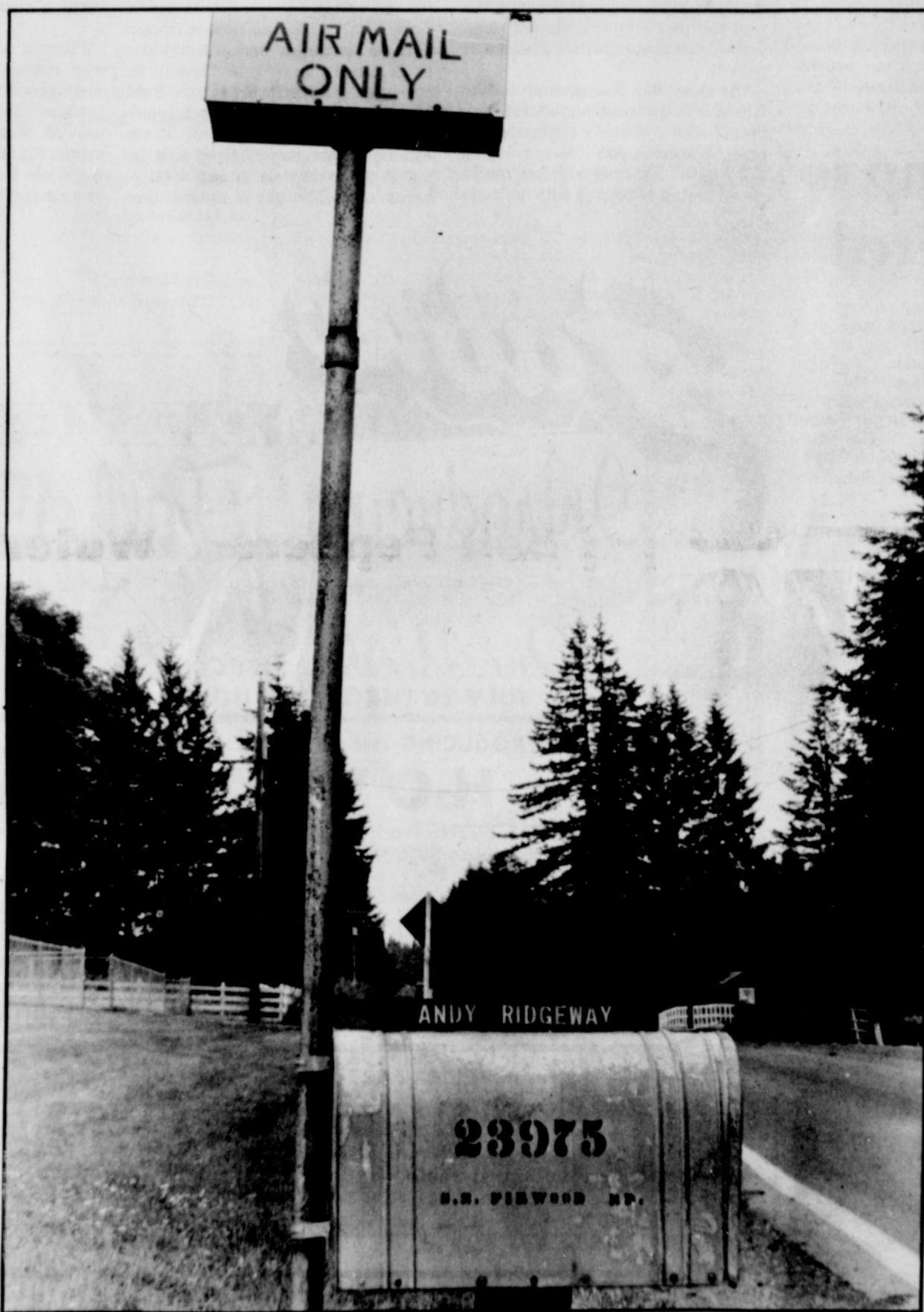


Mailboxes offer variety to local letter carriers

Sandy area residents seem concerned about the monotony that is the traditional lot of the letter carrier, since a number of homeowners have taken pains to create unique mailboxes. Whether or not the mail carriers benefit from the variety, passers-by often enjoy the results. The mailbox below seems to expect deliveries from low-flying airplanes.
