Seedling reservations available now

Brewster performs

Oregon's nonindustrial forest landowners can reserve the forest seedlings now they will need for next winter's planting, under a plan announced today by the Oregon State Department of Forestry.

Private owners of forest land, who own less than 5,000 acres, can now reserve seedlings through Oct. 1, or until the stock supply is depleted. Other persons must wait and use order blanks

available in October.

Approximately 4.5 million Douglas fir and hybrid poplar seedlings are available for nonindustrial forest landowners to reserve. Seedling order minimums have been lowered from last year so that now minimum orders of 400 Douglas fir and 100 hybrid poplar may be ordered.

The reservation plan will allow nonindustrial landowners to conduct har-

vesting operations this summer and early fall or to clear brush lands for reforestation with the assurance that seedlings will be available this winter for planting.

While seedling prices are determined annually following a crop inventory in September, estimates have been determined for this reservation system. Prices average \$60 a thousand for

Douglas fir, and \$89 a thousand for hybrid poplar.

Under the reservation system, deposits of \$20 must be made with the reservation order for orders up through 900 seedlings; this deposit increases to \$50 for orders of 1,000 - 10,000 seedlings. The deposit is \$100 for 10,000 - 30,000 seedlings, and it increases to \$300 for orders of 30,000 seedlings or more.

Order blanks and complete information on the reser-

vation system may be obtained from the Public Affairs office at the State Forester's headquarters, 2600 State Street, Salem 97310; from any district office of the department; and from any office of cooperating agencies, including Extension Service, Soil Conservation Service, Agricultural Conservation and Stabilization Service and Soil and Water Conservation Districts.

Dogwood plants need care

If the leaves of your dogwood tree take on an odd curl or discoloration every summer, the tree may be telling you it doesn't like your soil or its exposure to the sun. Or it may not like the kind of care you are giving it.

Horticulture extension agent Ray McNeilan advises gardeners who are trying to grow a dogwood tree in their yard to look at the native habitat of this tree. In its natural state it is found growing in soil of average fertility with excellent drainage characteristics.

The dogwood does not do well in heavy, wet, poorly drained soils.

Usually the dogwood is found in nature growing under or near tall trees which furnish filtered sunlight. Seldom are they found growing in full, open sunlight. The open, sunny yard can cause problems for most dogwoods. During hot, sunny weather the leaves may curl or fold to try to escape the hot sunlight.

In areas with dependable,

hot, sunny weather, sunburn damage to the trunk becomes a problem. In western Oregon, there is more of a problem from mechanical damage to the trunk and crown area.

A newly planted dogwood will need watering regularly through its first summer in the year. Once the tree is established, water infrequently. Fertilizer may be needed every several years. Avoid using weed and feed lawn fertilizers near dogwood trees.
