SERGEANT MATLOVICH VS. THE U.S. AIR FORCE

An Air Force sergeant fights to stay in the service after declaring his homosexuality in 'Sergeant Matlovich vs. the U.S. Air Force,' a world premiere movie, suggested by an actual incident, which will be presented Aug. 21 on 'NBC Monday Night at the Movies.'

Matlovich (Brad Dourif), a decorated Vietnam veteran, faces a court martial after his declaration. The Air Force maintains that he be discharged because his homosexuality violates regulations. But his attorney maintains that the regulation is unconstitutional.

Matlovich fights to stay in the service, saying it is his life and that his homosexuality would not adversely affect his performance.

The drama, filmed on location in southern California, co-stars Marc Singer, Frank Converse, William Daniels, Stephen Elliott and Rue McClanahan.

For an actor who has enjoyed his greatest success portraying individuals rooted in this planet's history, Lorne Greene is quite excited about the prospects of his upcoming ABC-TV adventure series 'BATTLESTAR GALACTICA,' which will premiere with a spectacular three-hour episode on Sunday, Sept. 17.

"It's a gigantic series," Greene said recently by phone from his California home. "The whole project is immense. It's the most expensive series ever produced, costing probably more than \$1 million per episode."

Greene, for 14 years the rugged Cartwright patriarch on the beloved long-running western series 'Bonanza,' will trade in his 10-gallon hat for the otherworldly uniform of Adama, the equally patriarchal commander of the giant warship Galactica, carrying the remnants of a once-thriving human civilization now devastated by war. It's a role for which he immersed himself in science-fiction literature as soon as he landed it.

"I was familiar with the space heroes of the past but I didn't have a particular favorite," Greene said. "What I immediately did was to get some of the works of the 10 best science-fiction authors, such as Frederick C. Pohl, and acquaint myself with their ideas."

The public should certainly give the series a chance at any rate. The series pilot has been

released as a feature film in Canadian theaters and has reportedly broken several box office records. The market is there for serious-minded space adventures.

Beyond the special effects, Greene reflected, the series will try to take a personal, human view of life in space. "What does it feel like to live your entire life on a spaceship? What kind of problems, physical and psychological, could develop?" Greene continued. "These are the questions our stories should deal with."

This is not the first touch of dealing with the future for the vigorous 63-year-old native of Ottawa, Canada. After having served many years in Canada as a newscaster and with Canadian troops called to fight during World War II in the 1940s, he and fellow actors formed the Jupiter Theater in Toronto in 1948, where he performed and directed many productions until coming to New York in 1953. There one of his first roles in early television was in a 'Studio One' adaptation of George Orwell's '1984.' "I played Big Brother," Greene said with a slightly ominous drawl in his voice.

ture anything like it again. "The detective series 'Griff' didn't last long after that but Greene has kept busy, between acting in several TV-movies as well as the feature films 'Earthquake' and 'Tidal Wave,' narrating the syndicated nature series 'Lorne Greene's Last of the Wild' and engaging in conservation activities relating to the environment and endangered animal species. He remarked that he was deeply concerned over a current court case in Nevada involving the disposition of herds of wild horses that may or may not be turned out of their natural environment."

Now with 'BATTLESTAR GALACTICA,' termed a science-fiction in its publicity material, Greene may have another hit in his career if the advance praise of the series holds true when it begins next month. What the series producers are striving for, according to Greene, is not just cut-and-dried futuristic scientific development and not just fantastic adventures plucked from scriptwriters' fanciful imaginations but "a combination of both." Also, in a parallel to the popular series 'Star Trek,' Greene says that the episodes will try to relate to our contemporary world with themes that are timely.

But the show is not without a link to the past. "Our uniforms derive from ancient Egyptian styles of clothing," Greene said, "like those from the time of King Tut." Speculations may have been influenced by visitors from outer space haven't been ignored by the show's creators because, according to Greene, a second unit journeyed to the ancient monuments of former civilizations in Egypt this month to obtain footage that will serve as background for flashbacks of the world from which the space travelers originated.

His best-remembered roles have been benevolent ones, except perhaps his portrayal of Kunta Kinte's inhuman, original owner in the miniseries 'Roots.' "I received a considerable personal response to my part in 'Roots,'" Greene said, "not entirely in favor of the character but there were some who said I didn't go far enough" in capturing the man's cruelty.

Greene said that among the best acting advice he has received is the adage "Don't impersonate—personify." "If you're on the lookout for someone to personify the strong but benevolent patriarchal leader of a band of space travelers, you probably couldn't do better."
