

## Committee formed to support budget

In an effort to win approval of the \$1.667 million budget for the coming school year at Sandy High, the school board is seeking persons to join an action committee to urge its passage.

The group will be called Citizens for Education. George Waldrop will serve as treasurer of the group.

Superintendent Jack Peters told the board members that a local businessman has offered a donation to get the committee under way.

A chairman for the committee has not been named.

The levy request has gone down to defeat three times. A fourth election is slated for Sept. 19.

## Reynolds to enter plea

OREGON CITY — Jake Clarence Reynolds of Eagle Creek will enter a plea Tuesday to charges in connection with the fatal shooting of a Portland man at Irene's Tavern in Sandy June 1.

Reynolds, 27, is charged with murder, aggravated felony murder and first degree robbery.

Reynolds appeared in Clackamas County Circuit Court Tuesday, Aug. 15 with his attorney, John Loeb, to

ask for a one-week continuance, which was granted by Judge Charles Sams.

Loeb explained that he had just returned from vacation and that Reynolds was un-

certain as to how he would plead.

Reynolds' appearance will be at 9 a.m. in the county courthouse in Oregon City.

Jerry Lane Nored, 25, of Sweet Home, faces charges of murder and first degree robbery in the shooting. His trial is set for Sept. 20.

### Director hired

Bruce W. Scarth, former choir director at Lake View High School, has been hired by Sandy High as choral director.

Scarth will replace Don Tucker who resigned this month to take a similar position with North Clackamas County High School.

A screening committee, chaired by board member Ginny Brewster, selected Scarth over a number of applicants for the job.

## Roof at high school needs fire retardant, board told

Although the budget for Sandy High School has not been passed, the board has already obligated itself to expend approximately \$21,000 not listed in the budget to bring the school's roof up to fire insurance standards.

The board learned Monday night that a representative from Underwriter's Laboratory inspected the roof last month and found it did not have the required amount of fire retardant coating. "Diathon

Elastomer."

The roof has passed UL inspections the past four years. Inspectors apparently overlooked the fact that it did not meet insurance standards.

George Waldrop, the board's insurance agent of record, told board members that he could place the school's fire insurance with a company that did not require the fire retardant but that the rate would be considerably higher.

Nearly all of the school's

roof — 70,000 square feet — does not have the coating. Waldrop stated that a ballpark figure of 30 cents per square foot could do the job.

"It's a potential hazard and should be taken care of," Waldrop recommended to the board.

Estimates on applying the retardant to the roof will be presented at the board's September meeting.

The board voted unanimously to have the job done.

## School open on Saturdays

Sandy High School will have its doors open on Saturdays for the coming school term for students who have been truant from classes.

Vice principal Gene Carlson announced the new policy at the Monday night school board meeting and stated its intention was to "get students into class."

Students who have two truantancies in a class will be

required to make up the absences at a Saturday session which will last from 8 a.m. to noon.

"Students will not be admitted if they are not on time or if they do not have books and materials to study during the period," the policy states.

"There will be no horseplay or visiting around," it continued. "You will be reassigned for next week if

you don't bring materials for study, or if you don't use what you brought. Failure to attend will result in immediate suspension from school."

Superintendent Jack Peters stated that the new policy emphasizes the "positive" approach in dealing with truant students.

In past years, accumulated truantancies in one class resulted in an automatic failure.

## SUHS gets 'Tut' passes

Sandy High School has been given a block of almost 900 tickets for the King Tut exhibit in Seattle.

District Superintendent Jack Peters told the school board at its Monday night meeting that the tickets are for students, teachers and parent chaperones. After those request are filled, the

board agreed to have remaining tickets allotted to patrons of the district interested in travelling to the exhibit in a chartered school bus.

Two trips have been scheduled to Seattle. The first is Monday, Sept. 18; the second is Monday, Oct. 16. Persons interested in at-

tending the exhibit with a high school ticket are required to pay only the transportation cost of the bus.

A film program detailing what the exhibit is about will be shown Wednesday, Sept. 13. Further information on tickets and the film preview may be obtained by calling Glenda Carmony at 668-5360.

## Firemen win trophy

A six-man contingent from the Sandy Fire Department competed at the 1st Annual West Coast Firemen's Muster in Eureka, Calif., recently, and came home with a second place trophy in the motorized pumper category.

The muster is a competition between fire departments in job-related

events. The motorized pumper event, in which Sandy took second, involved laying 250 feet of hose, attaching it to the vehicle and knocking over a target. And one of the conditions of the competition is that the vehicle be somewhat antiquated.

The Sandy squad of Ed Hanning, Gary Connelly, Rick Carey, Pat Beckman, Chuck Hanson and Dave Senn competed in the Class III division which included vehicles built from 1931-1940. That division was the largest of the competition which makes the second place trophy even more significant, said assistant fire chief Connelly.

The muster, which drew crews from as far away as Colorado, was filmed by ABC television crews, to possibly be shown on Wide World of Sports.

It was also the first muster for the Sandy crew. They feel that with a little practice, they can pick off the top trophy next year.

"The muster will be in Bend next year, and we're really going to get them," Connelly said.

The Sandy team also competed in the hose cart race and the bucket brigade, but lost out to bigger departments. The Merced County Fire Department took top honors in the motorized pumpers over Sandy, a fact which Connelly plans on alleviating next year.
