Family stove works expands from gas station beginning

What began as a family business in a Eugene gas station has mushroomed to a nation-wide stove works with a third state outlet recently opened in Sandy.

Schrader Wood Stoves in Western Alley Building on Proctor Boulevard is managed by Patti Fletcher with husband Artie Fletcher who commutes between Sandy and another Schrader store in Gresham.

His mother, Feril Fletcher, owns the 3 1/2-year-old business and manages the family's first store in Portland. Her brother, George Schrader, designed the unique Schrader wood stove out of a personal concern for the high cost of energy.

Today another brother,

Chuck Schrader, directs a crew of 40 welders in two shifts in a Eugene factory that manufactures some 50 wood stoves daily. Schrader wood stoves now are sold in 42 states.

The family has applied for patents on the stove's unique design which features front doors that part for the appearance of a fireplace or fold together for the appearance of a kitchen stove. Doors are made of aluminum and seven alloys for heat resistance, while the rest of the stove is made of 1/4-inch high-grade steel. The doors are molded, but the rest of the stove is welded together.

Interest in wood stoves was rekindled recently with nostalgic rebirth of the

traditional Franklin stove design. Now people are finding new uses for the efficient wood-burning stoves, according to store manager Patti Fletcher.

"Today we find many people are turning to wood stoves instead of fireplaces for cost savings and more efficiency," she said.

Schrader has sold wood stoves to both state and federal government agencies throughout Oregon for use in camps.

The wood stoves are becoming increasingly popular with contractors, Patti Fletcher said. Schrader also makes a wood stove for mobile homes, and claims the only heavy-duty wood stove on the market approved for use in mobile homes, she said.

The Schrader stove is said to burn all night long on 24 inches of firewood.

EQC sets discussion on field burning rules

Rules governing field burning in the Willamette Valley will be a major topic for discussion at the Oregon Environmental Quality Commission (EQC) meeting Friday, Aug. 25, with a public hearing to follow at 10.

The meeting will be held in Room 602 of the Multnomah County Courthouse, 1021 SW 4th Ave. in Portland at 9 a.m.

The EQC will discuss portions of the field burning rules pertaining to the moisture content of loose straw in fields and the burning of priority acreage along highways and freeways. Recent events surrounding both of these items has brought a request by the Commission to review these two rules.

The public hearing is on proposed amendments to the Oregon Clean Air Act Implementation Plan that would include rules on conflict of interest of members on environmental boards. The proposed rules are required by the 1977 amendments to the Clean Air Act. The Commission may consider adoption of the proposed rules following the public hearing. Similar rules were enacted by the state for the water pollution discharge permit program.

The Commission will also consider adopting the sewage works construction grants priority list for 1979. The list is used to determine which sewage construction projects will receive Federal grant money in 1979. Placement of projects on the list is determined in part by need, impact on the environment, and stage of construction.

The EQC will also consider the adoption of proposed rules governing the licensing of hazardous waste management facilities in Oregon. The proposed rule changes would incorporate

legislation into the rules that would allow licensing of solid waste landfills to dispose of small quantities of some hazardous wastes, and would remove a restriction that the EQC must approve hazardous wastes before they are imported to Oregon for disposal.

In related action, the Commission will consider authorizing the DEQ to hold a public hearing to amend the Chem-Nuclear Company's hazardous waste disposal license to permit better supervision of the disposal operation by the DEQ.

The EQC will hear staff reports and hold a discussion of noise impact caused by Portland's Transit Mall and other major transit corridors. In addition, the staff will present a progress report on the voluntary noise testing program at DEQ vehicle inspection stations.

The Commission will consider authorizing the DEQ to hold a public hearing on a proposed mandatory noise inspection program in the Portland Metropolitan area. In a related noise matter, the Commission will consider authorizing a public hearing to amend noise rules pertaining to the sale of new snowmobiles.

In other business, the EQC will consider authorizing the DEQ to hold a public hearing on proposed amendments to state septic tank and experimental sewage disposal rules; will consider a variance request by Delta Sandy and Gravel Company of Eugene from solid waste regulations; will hear an appeal from the Beaverton Mall developer about the State indirect source rules; and will consider a petition from the Friends of Josephine County to have Josephine County declared an air quality maintenance area.

Head Start to take applications

Head Start is now taking applications for the fall 1978 session.

The Head Start program, a federally funded pre-school program for low income families and handicapped children, is sponsored by Clackamas County Children's Commission.

The purpose of the program is to provide experiences for eligible pre-school children which are planned to help them grow socially, emotionally, physically, and mentally.

The program also includes medical and dental services for the child enrolled.

Classes will be held two days a week beginning with the second week of October and will run eight months.

The program this year will be held at the Barton school on Highway 224.

Transportation will be provided to and from the school.

The age criteria is as follows: Oregon City, Milwaukie, Oak Grove, and Gladstone — 4 years old by Nov. 15, 1978. West Linn, Sandy, Estacada, Molalla, and Canby — 4 or 5 years old by Nov. 15, 1978.

OSU opens bids for new aquaculture lab

Oregon State University will open bids Aug. 31 for construction of an aquaculture laboratory to be located near the OSU Marine Science Center in Newport.

The estimated \$2.5 million facility is planned for

completion in late 1979 as part of the OSU Marine Science Center research complex. It will include areas for general aquaculture study, a pathology laboratory and a simulation-economics study area.

Funding for the new structure will come from the National Marine Fisheries Service.

Marine-related research projects at the Newport center currently involve more than 100 staff members from OSU, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife. The aquaculture research program is expected eventually to involve 60 staff members, mostly from OSU.

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
