

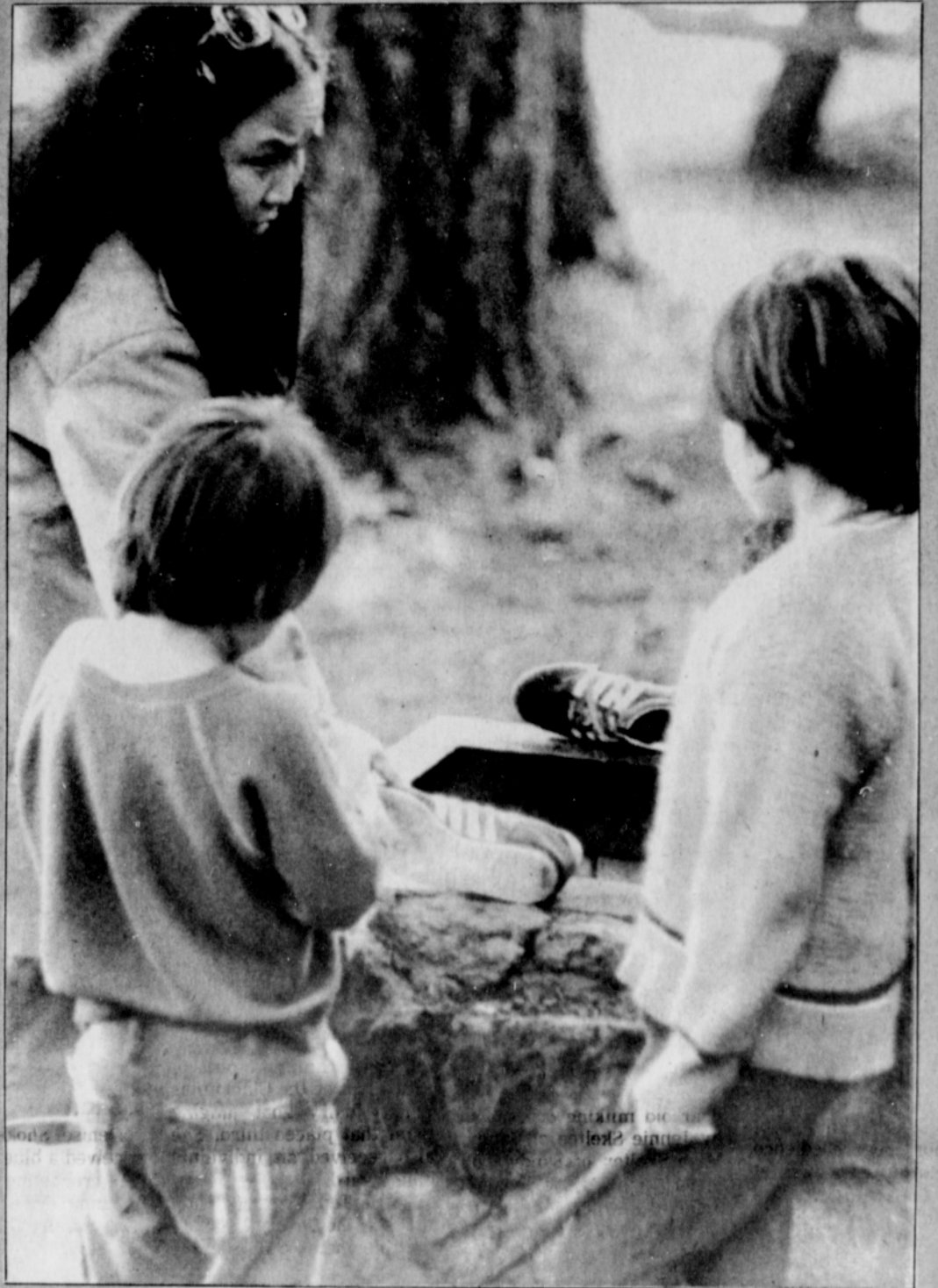


LABOR DAY just wasn't meant for work as Michele Bannister will attest to. In fact about the only thing she did on
