

## Santa slates Sandy stop

Santa is coming to town by helicopter at 10 a.m., Saturday, Dec. 2, with touchdown in Sandy's Heritage Square.

His arrival heads a long list of community Christmas festivities sponsored by Sandy Area Merchants. Santa will preside over Sandy's traditional Christmas auction at 1 p.m., Dec. 2, in Oddfellows' Hall on Pioneer Boulevard. All new merchandise, donated by Sandy businesses goes on the auction block to defray the local merchant committee's cost of city-wide Christmas promotions.

In addition to new merchandise and antiques, the committee is considering the enlistment of city officials and other leading figures to be auctioned as slaves for a day. Auctioneer will be Paul Spence.

The festivities this year include a special Kid's Day Saturday, Dec. 16, with free games, prizes and play performances from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in Oddfellows' Hall. Children can try their hands at dart throw, pop guns or a bean-bag toss, and everyone wins a prize.

The Sandy Mountain Festival Players will present special children's showings of "King Arthur's Calamity" at 2 p.m. and 3 p.m. in Oddfellows' Hall. Admission will be free.

The merchants' Christmas committee will repeat their annual drawing which last year drew several persons to Sandy and surprised many with Santa, himself, emerging as grand prize winner.

The drawing this year will be held at 1 p.m., Dec. 16, in Heritage Square. All merchandise has been donated by area businesses to help fund the merchants committee's yuletide celebrations.

A small community Christmas tree goes up in Oddfellows' Hall for the city-wide auction Dec. 2 and will remain up through kids' day, Dec. 16.

The Sandy Area Merchants' Christmas committee includes chairman Bob Gedder, Sharon Sizemore, Elaine Decker, Harriet Scales, and Lynn Ellis.

## Stereo theft reported

Burglars broke into the home of Michael McDonald of Boring last weekend, removing stereo equipment and other items valued at nearly \$3000, Clackamas County sheriff's deputies

reported. McDonald was out of town over the weekend. The thieves gained entry by breaking out his upstairs window, deputies said.

## Investigation complete

An investigation into an incident involving an altercation between Brightwood resident James Purdy and three Clackamas County deputies has been completed and is sitting on the desk of Sheriff John Renfro.

Renfro has been out of the county for a class on explosives the past two weeks and will be gone through this week, according to a department spokesman. It is not known what action he will take on the matter after his return.

Clackamas District Attorney, James O'Leary said last week that he "has no plans" to bring charges against Purdy for his part in the matter. He said any action taken would have to be initiated by Renfro.

Purdy was forcibly arrested at his home the night of Aug. 28 by the three deputies. The deputies believed he had information on the investigation of a larceny in the Brightwood area and was uncooperative in divulging that knowledge. Purdy was handcuffed and sprayed in the face with a chemical deterrent while

being arrested.

The deputies claim, in their report that Purdy initiated the fracas by striking one of them in the chest.
