WORK ON the Kelso School has been slowed by the recent cold weather that has plagued Sandy but employees of the Todd Construction Company are hopeful of completing the project by the beginning of the 1979 school year. The Kelso school will be the third one built on the site which is located

on Kelso Road just off Orient Drive. The first school was built in the 1890's; it burned to the ground a short time later. A second school was built and eventually sold to the Sandy Grange. It is hoped that the new school will help ease overcrowding in the Sandy grade school system.

IRS checks go unclaimed

Over \$200,000 in 1977 federal income tax refunds have not been claimed by their owners, according to Ralph B. Short, Internal Revenue Service District Director for Oregon.

Short explained that the Oregon IRS has received the names of over 900 persons who filed federal income tax returns from Oregon in 1977. These checks, he said, were originally mailed to the home address listed on the tax form but were returned to the IRS Service Center in Ogden by the post office.

"By publishing these names," Short said, "we hope to encourage these people to contact IRS so that we can arrange to have their refund checks remailed." The refunds range from \$5 to \$2,300. The average unclaimed refund amounts to \$234.58. The total amount is \$222,148.86.

Earlier this summer, the names of 172 persons with undelivered refunds totalling \$23,628.99 for years prior to 1977, were published. Most of these people were alerted through this process. However, a few still remain on the unclaimed refund list.

Persons on the unclaimed list should either call their IRS information toll-free number or contact their local IRS office. Information needed for this includes: Name and address as shown on the tax return, present name and address, tax year for which refund is believed due, social security number, amount of refund

claimed, signature of taxpayer, and any other pertinent information needed to verify the claim.

Short indicated that processing involved in applying for unclaimed refund checks normally takes from six to eight weeks before a

check is reissued.

Stolen auto recovered

A 1977 Datsun pickup leased by Von Brashler of Brightwood was stolen Tuesday, Nov. 21 from the Sandy Post parking lot at 17270 SE Bluff Rd. The theft occurred between 4-6 p.m.

The vehicle was recovered the following day in the possession of four high school students. The juveniles were taken to the high school where a fifth student was involved in the case.

Two boys, ages 14 and 15, and three girls, ages 14, 15 and 16, were involved in the incident. The 15-year-old boy was charged with auto theft, and the others were charged with auto theft by possession. They were referred to juvenile authorities and released in custody of their parents.

Two incidents of vandalism were reported this week. Mastercraft Homes reported Nov. 22 that windows stored in the garage of a newly constructed home were broken and lumber was stolen. The windows were valued at \$150, and the lumber at \$52.

Two grounds lamps and a tree were destroyed at

Heritage Square in Sandy Nov. 24. The lamps were worth \$100, with the value of the tree estimated at \$200.

A credit card imprinter was reported stolen Nov. 26 from TJ's Restaurant on Proctor Street in Sandy. The imprinter was taken between midnight and 2 a.m. No estimate of its value was given.

James Ramsey of Boring was cited for careless driving Nov. 27 at 11 a.m. Police reported that Ramsey was observed traveling on several Sandy streets without observing traffic lights or stop signs.

Forest Service jobs available

Applications for seasonal employment with the Forest Service will be available Dec. 1 through Jan. 15, the agency announced this week.

Non-clerical positions to be filled include field jobs as aides and technicians in forestry, range management, physical science, engineering, surveying, biological science, and hydrology. Applicant must be 18 at the time of availability for employment.

Selections for seasonal

jobs will begin in mid-February with jobs starting after May 12 and ending before Oct. 1. Salaries will range from \$3.57 to \$5.05 per hour. About 4,000 jobs will be filled in the Pacific Northwest Region of the Forest Service (Oregon and Washington) where more than 16,000 applications were received last year.

Firefighting positions require passage of a physical fitness "step test" equivalent to running 1 1/2 miles in 12

minutes or less.

Applicants may submit only one application to the Forest Service, and may indicate only one location preference.

Information on other seasonal jobs and specific programs is available at Civil Service Commission and National Forest Supervisor's offices.

Education, availability, and prior experience will determine an applicant's chance for employment.

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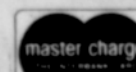
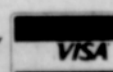
