Air quality of bypass plan eyed

Possible effects of the proposed Oregon City bypass upon the air quality of the surrounding area is now being studied by the Oregon Department of Transportation. This air quality study which began early last month, should be completed in late December.

The study, undertaken to comply with state and federal environmental regulations, is being conducted in two stages. Air

monitoring devices now located at 10 sites within the project corridor are sampling carbon monoxide concentrations. Results of this study will then be applied to traffic forecasts developed for both alternate routes and the existing route to determine future air quality levels.

The completed air quality study will be included in the Draft Environmental Impact

Statement (DEIS) now being prepared for the project. This document will be available for public review and comment in April, 1979 with a public hearing scheduled for May, 1979.

Two alternate routes have been developed for the bypass.

Both routes begin at the Park Place Interchange on I-205 and intersect with Highway 213 (Molalla Avenue) near Clackamas Community College. One alternate routes the bypass through Newell Creek Canyon and the other runs along the ridge near Holly Lane.
