'Gentle Ben' author to visit in Sandy

Award winning writer Walt Morey will visit Sandy High and Sandy Elementary schools next Tuesday to talk with small groups of students about his profession and the characters in his books.

Morey is the author of "Gentle Ben," published in 1965 and later made into a television series. He won the Dutton Junior Animal Book Award for it and has written several other books that have been nationally honored.

The author will visit the high school and intermediate school from 8:30 to 3:30. Parents are invited to attend

the sessions with their children. Specific times for the visits may be obtained by calling the schools.

Morey will also hold an autograph session Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. at the Sandy Public Library.

The author lives near the Willamette River outside Portland. His other works include "Kavik, the Wolf Dog," "Angry Waters," "Deep Trouble," "Canyon Winter," "Scrub Dog of Alaska," "Year of the Black Pony," and "Operation Blue Bear."

Strike scene watched

Three department heads at Sandy Union High School took time off from school this week to find out how another school deals with striking teachers.

Dennis Crow, Randy Hutchinson and Bob Stocking were sent by superintendent Jack Peters to Hood River High School where teachers there have staged a walkout.

"They went to observe what happens in a strike situation," Peters said. "We

want to avoid a strike as much as possible but we want to know what kinds of things happen if it does."

Department heads from Sandy High also observed the strike situation at David Douglas High School in September.

Peters is preparing for negotiations with the teachers at Sandy High for a new contract. The current agreement will expire at the end of the school year.

Trojan declared 'safe'

Trojan nuclear plant is safe and should be allowed to resume operations, according to the federal Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff.

The plant has been closed since March when it was discovered the walls of the control building weren't built

to withstand earthquakes.

The commission staff ordered Portland General Electric Co. to shut down the facility until hearings on the safety of the walls could be completed. The Atomic Safety and Licensing board will resume hearings Monday at the Capitol in Salem.
