Tow truck regulations seen in near future

Clackamas County may soon have an ordinance regulating certain tow truck fees and procedures in the near future.

The ordinance is being proposed to set standard rates for rural and urban areas of the county for vehicles towed at the request of the Clackamas County Sheriff's Department.

The towing of vehicles requested by private parties will not be affected.

The ordinance, which is being patterned after one in Multnomah County, will designate areas in the county as either urban or rural. The proposed rate scale lists an

urban tow as \$24.50 and a rural tow as \$27.50.

Also proposed is establishment of a \$4 per day outside storage charge by a garage, and \$5 for inside storage. The proposal calls for free storage of a towed vehicle for the first four hours.

There is currently no ordinance covering tow truck operations for vehicles towed at the request of the county.

The rates and other provisions in the proposed ordinance are subject to

change after the public meeting. That meeting will be held in the Community Center building of Clackamas Community College, Room 117, at 6 p.m.

"All tow truck operators and members of the public are invited to attend and participate in discussing the proposal which will be submitted to the commissioners for adoption," said Clackamas deputy Jake Higginbotham.

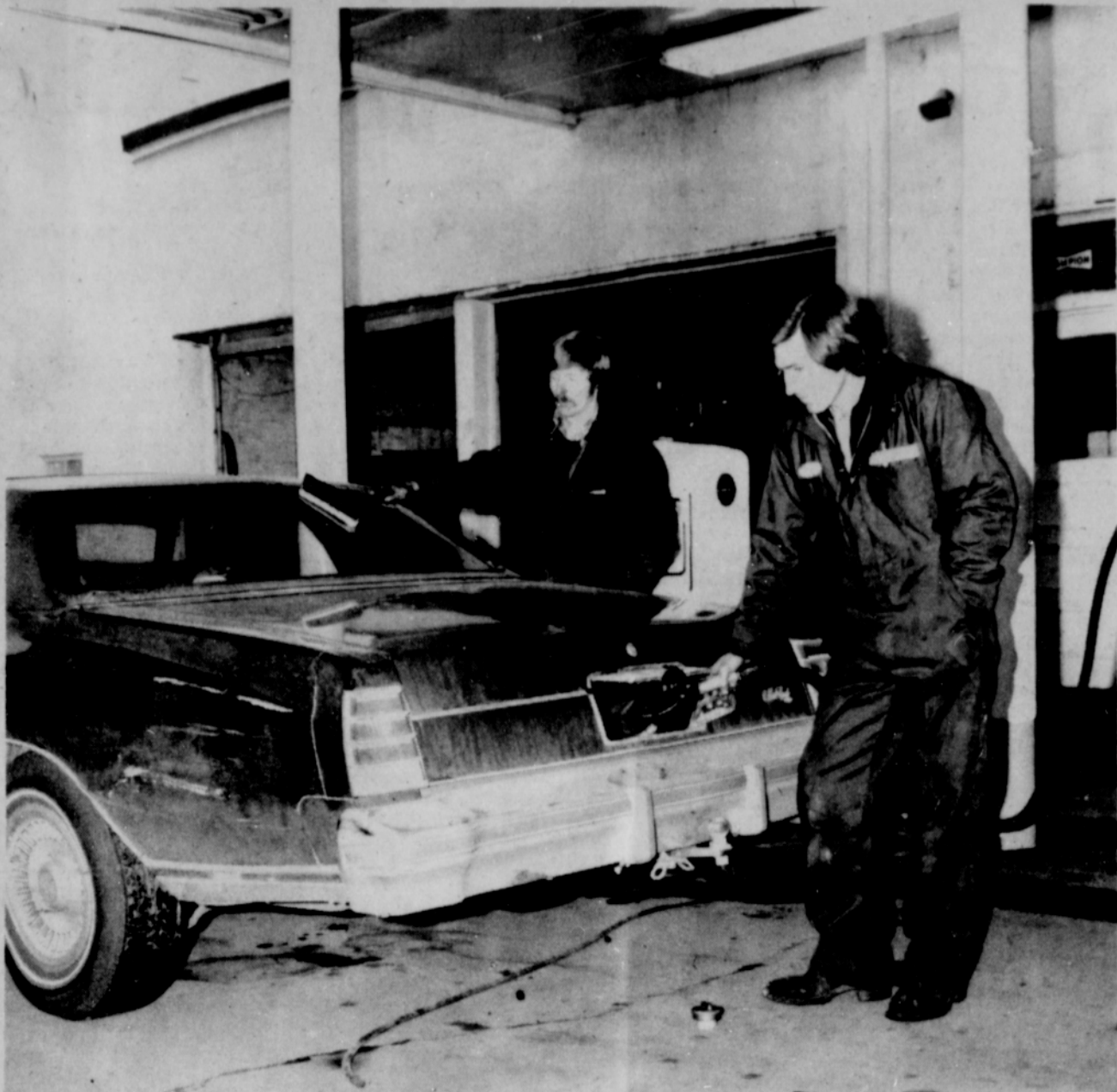

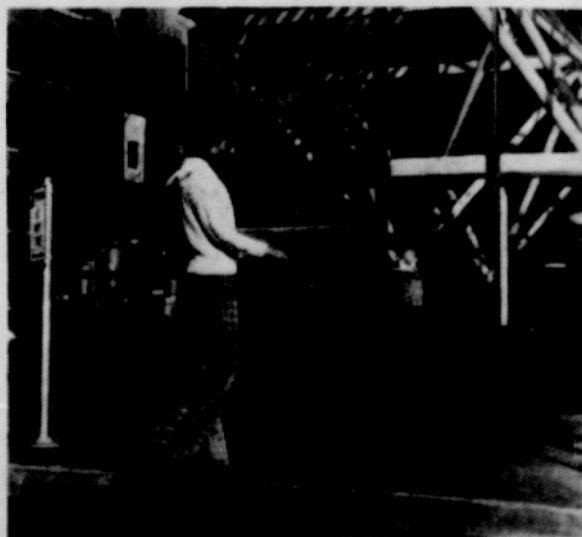

Frontier architecture

NEW OFFICES will be housed in the two-story Homestead Building nearing completion on Proctor Boulevard in Sandy. Tim Kasch of Dover is designer and owner of the new facility. When completed, the building will house as many as 14 new retail businesses and offices. The frontier architecture features a second-floor boardwalk and interior and outdoor

lights that resemble old gas lights. "I wanted the building to look like old-time Sandy," Kasch said. "and some people tell me that it looks a lot like a steamboat." Construction of the \$250,000 office building began in early fall, with Kasch Construction major contractor.

National Forest revenues shared

A record \$132.7 million, including more than \$4 million to Clackamas County, will be distributed to 31 Oregon and 27 Washington counties as their share of revenues from the sale and use of national forest products and services during

1978. The Oregon counties will share \$101 million and the Washington counties will share \$31 million, according to Regional Forester R.E. Worthington, of the U.S. Forest Service. Last year's totals were \$90 million and \$29 million.

The money being returned to the counties represents 25 percent of the money collected by the Forest Service from the sale of timber, and from grazing, recreation, minerals, and other land-use charges where national forests are located. The money is to be

used for public schools and roads.

The amounts to the counties have been greater since passage of the National Forest Management Act of 1976. The base on which the state shares are now figured includes credits made to timber purchasers for building roads, and funds used by the Forest Service to improve timber sale areas. Before passage of the act, these were not included in the base on which the 25 percent was figured.

Oregon leads the nation in its share of the \$239 million being distributed to 39 states and Puerto Rico.
