'The Impossible Years'



GETTING EXCITED about a future party are actors and actresses in the One Way Theater's upcoming stage production, "The Impossible Years." The youngsters at left are trying to get Linda (Vicki Mills) enthused about

Live theater enthusiasts will once again be entertained in Sandy by local actors and actresses when the Sandy One Way Theater presents its first performance of the 1979 season next weekend.

A group of energetic actors and actresses will present "The Impossible Years," a family comedy in two acts. The play opens next Friday night, Jan. 19, at The Theater, 38915 Proctor Blvd., with curtain time at 8 o'clock.

It will also be presented Saturday night, Jan. 20, and the following weekend, Jan. 26 and 27.

(The play had been scheduled for the Oddfellows Hall but was moved to The Theater to accommodate more seating.)

"Impossible Years" is being directed by Larry LaMarsh. The cast stars Harry McLane as Dr. Kingsley, a psychiatrist and father of two teen-age daughters: Linda, played by Vicki Mills, and Abbey, played by Dawn Davidson.

The plot revolves around attempts by Dr. Kingsley and his wife, Alice, played by Shirley Lawson, to cope with the antics of their young daughters. Many humorous situations ensue as Dr. Kingsley tries and fails to do everything "by the book," his own psychiatric work on

adolescence.

Others in the cast are Linda's boyfriend, Ricky (Rob Lawson), his father, Dr. Fleisher (John Kline), Linda's hilarious beatnik admirer (Bob Estes), her exuberant and unflappable gym teacher (Judy Sheppard) and Dr. Kingsley's publisher, Arnild Brecher (Jim Wilhite).

Others in the cast are Robert Brader, Cheryl McIlwain, Tiffany Davidson, Kim Miller, Sharon Jensen, Shannon Spradling, Eric and Nicole Hadly, all playing teen-age friends of Linda who bring dancing havoc into the home of Dr. Kingsley.

The One Way Theatre's last production was "Happy Birthday, Wanda June." A second production, "The Glass Menagerie," will be presented in March.

Tryouts for that classic play by Tennessee Williams will be held in The Theater next Sunday and Monday, Jan. 21 and 22, at 7 p.m. Harry McLane, director of "Happy Birthday, Wanda June," will direct the play.

A third production is planned for the spring.

The group hopes to produce all the plays in The Theater with its excellent acoustics, according to stage manager Sharon Davidson.

"The One Way Theater is always looking for interested

persons in the community to help with the productions," she said. Persons who have an interest in working with and promoting live community theater in Sandy are asked to call the group's coordinator, Judy Sheppard, at the Community School, 668-5744, or treasurer Marlene Tebo, 383-2345, to express an interest.

"The cast and production crew of 'The Impossible Years' has been working hard since last fall to put on a top rate performance for the community," Mrs. Davidson said. "We urge your support in order for future productions to be planned."

Admission for adults is \$2.50 and \$1.50 for seniors and children under 12. Season tickets may be purchased for \$5, a \$2.50 savings for those who will attend all three productions this season.
